5	SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 2002, Insurance Code is
6	amended to add the following section:
7	Sec. 2002.007. Coverage for Residential Property Water
8	Damage Claims. (a) If a residential property policy, including an
9	endorsement, provides coverage for loss resulting from continuous
10	or repeated seepage or leakage of water or steam, the policy must
11	not restrict coverage, and the insurer must not deny a claim, based
12	on the duration of the seepage or leakage if an insured notifies
13	the insurer no later than 30 days after the loss was discovered or
14	should have been discovered.
15	(b) The insurer must provide a written disclosure to the
16	policyholder that clearly describes the 30-day notice requirement
17	in subsection (a) of this section. The insurer must include the
18	disclosure on the declarations page, or a separate disclosure page
19	provided to the policyholder with the declarations page.
20	(c) This section applies to an insurer as defined in Section
21	544.352(2), writing residential property insurance as defined in
22	Section 544.352(3) in this state.
23	(d) The commissioner may adopt rules as necessary to
24	implement this section.

## H.B. No. 3579

1 SECTION 2. Section 2002.007, Insurance Code, as amended by 2 this Act, applies only to an insurance policy that is delivered, 3 issued for delivery, or renewed on or after January 1, 2018. A 4 policy delivered, issued for delivery, or renewed before January 1, 5 2018, is governed by the law as it existed immediately before the 6 effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for 7 that purpose.
