AN ACT

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 44, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter D to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER D. FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE
8	Sec. 44.101. APPLICABILITY. This subchapter applies only
9	to a school district that is ranked among the 50 highest in student
10	enrollment, as determined by the commissioner.
11	Sec. 44.102. FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE. (a) A school district
12	shall maintain on the district's Internet website an electronic
13	database of district finances. The database must include:
14	(1) for the immediately preceding fiscal year:
15	(A) total expenditures as a dollar amount and a
16	dollar amount per student in average daily attendance;
17	(B) total revenue as a dollar amount and a dollar
18	amount per student in average daily attendance;
19	(C) total revenue from property taxes as a dollar
20	amount and a dollar amount per student in average daily attendance;
21	<u>and</u>
22	(D) the total number of full-time equivalent
23	<pre>positions for the district;</pre>
24	(2) in a searchable electronic format, the district's

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1	approved budget for the current fiscal year and each of the four
2	preceding fiscal years that, for each budget:
3	(A) identifies by name the accounts and divisions
4	of all money held or disbursed by the district;
5	(B) includes all revenue and expenditures in the
6	district's budget; and
7	(C) includes all combined accounts;
8	(3) the district's annual financial report for the
9	preceding five fiscal years;
10	(4) in a searchable electronic format, the transaction
11	register for each district checking account, including:
12	(A) for each check written from a district
13	<pre>checking account:</pre>
14	(i) the transaction amount;
15	(ii) the name of the payee;
16	(iii) the date the check was issued; and
17	(iv) a statement of the purpose of the
18	expenditure for which the check was written;
19	(B) monthly, quarterly, and semi-annual totals
20	for all expenditures;
21	(C) any electronic fund transfers;
22	(D) all payroll direct deposits; and
23	(E) any bank drafts for bond or loan payments;
24	(5) a visualization chart depicting district
25	financial data trends for the preceding five fiscal years that
26	shows for each fiscal year:
27	(A) total expenditures per student in average

- 1 daily attendance; 2 (B) total revenue per student in average daily 3 attendance; and 4 (C) the district property tax rate expressed in 5 dollars per \$100 valuation; 6 (6) an explanation of terminology used on 7 database, as appropriate; 8 (7) contact information for the district and members of the board of trustees of the district; and 9 10 (8) a link to a web page maintained by the district that provides instructions for submitting a request for information 11 12 under Chapter 552, Government Code. (b) District budget data must be formatted in a manner that 13 14 allows any person using the district's Internet website to perform 15 an analysis of the data. 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(1) update the electronic checking account 20 transaction register at least once each month, not later than the 21 22 30th day after the closing date of the most recent monthly statement 23 for the checking account;

- 5 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
