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- 2 relating to the creation of a countywide alert system for missing 3 adults.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 411, Government Code, is amended by 6 adding Subchapter P to read as follows:
- 7 SUBCHAPTER P. ALERT FOR MISSING ADULTS
- 8 Sec. 411.441. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
- 9 <u>(1) "Adult" means a person who is 18 years of age or</u>
- 10 <u>older.</u>

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- 11 (2) "Alert" means the countywide alert for missing
- 12 adults that is developed and implemented under this subchapter.
- 13 (3) "Local law enforcement agency" means a local law
- 14 enforcement agency with jurisdiction over the investigation of a
- 15 missing adult.
- 16 (4) "Serious bodily injury" has the meaning assigned
- 17 by Section 1.07, Penal Code.
- 18 Sec. 411.442. ALERT FOR MISSING ADULTS. With the
- 19 cooperation of the office of the governor and other appropriate law
- 20 enforcement agencies in this state, the department shall develop
- 21 and implement an alert to be activated in a county in which an adult
- 22 is missing.
- Sec. 411.443. ADMINISTRATION. (a) The director is the
- 24 statewide coordinator of the alert.

- 1 (b) The director shall adopt rules and issue directives as
- 2 necessary to ensure proper implementation of the alert. The rules
- 3 and directives must include:
- 4 (1) the procedures to be used by a local law
- 5 enforcement agency to verify whether an adult is:
- 6 (A) missing; and
- 7 (B) in imminent danger of serious bodily injury
- 8 or death;
- 9 (2) a description of the circumstances under which a
- 10 local law enforcement agency is required to report a missing adult
- 11 to the department; and
- 12 (3) the procedures to be used by an individual or
- 13 entity to report information about a missing adult to designated
- 14 media outlets in Texas.
- 15 <u>(c) The director shall prescribe forms for use by local law</u>
- 16 <u>enforcement agencies in requesting activation of the alert system</u>
- 17 in a county.
- 18 Sec. 411.444. DEPARTMENT TO RECRUIT PARTICIPANTS. The
- 19 department shall recruit local television and radio broadcasters,
- 20 private commercial entities, state or local governmental entities,
- 21 the public, and other appropriate persons to assist in developing
- 22 and implementing the alert system.
- Sec. 411.445. STATE AGENCIES. A state agency participating
- 24 in the alert system shall:
- 25 (1) cooperate with the department and assist in
- 26 developing and implementing the alert system; and
- 27 (2) establish a plan for providing relevant

- 1 information to applicable state officers, investigators, or
- 2 employees once the alert system has been activated.
- 3 Sec. 411.446. NOTIFICATION TO DEPARTMENT OF MISSING ADULT.
- 4 (a) A local law enforcement agency shall notify the department if
- 5 the agency:
- 6 (1) receives notice of a missing adult;
- 7 (2) verifies that at the time the adult is reported
- 8 missing:
- 9 <u>(A) the person reported missing is 18 years of</u>
- 10 age or older;
- 11 (B) the adult's location is unknown; and
- 12 (C) the adult has been missing for less than 72
- 13 hours;
- 14 (3) confirms that a preliminary investigation has
- 15 taken place with respect to the disappearance and that, as a result
- 16 of that investigation, the agency believes that the missing adult
- 17 is in imminent danger of serious bodily injury or death; and
- 18 (4) believes sufficient information is available to
- 19 disseminate to the public that could assist in locating the adult, a
- 20 person suspected of abducting the adult, or a vehicle suspected of
- 21 being used by the adult or in any abduction of the adult.
- 22 (b) The department may modify the criteria described by
- 23 Subsection (a) as necessary for the proper implementation of the
- 24 alert system.
- Sec. 411.447. ACTIVATION OF ALERT. (a) When a local law
- 26 enforcement agency notifies the department under Section 411.446,
- 27 the department shall confirm the accuracy of the information and,

- 1 if confirmed, immediately issue an alert under this subchapter in
- 2 accordance with department rules.
- 3 (b) In issuing the alert, the department shall send the
- 4 alert to designated media outlets in the county in which the adult
- 5 is missing. Following receipt of the alert, participating radio
- 6 stations and television stations and other participating media
- 7 outlets may issue the alert at designated intervals to assist in
- 8 locating the missing adult.
- 9 (c) The department shall also send the alert to:
- 10 (1) any appropriate local law enforcement agency; and
- 11 (2) a state agency described by Section 411.445.
- 12 Sec. 411.448. CONTENT OF ALERT. The alert must include:
- (1) all appropriate information that is provided by
- 14 the local law enforcement agency under Section 411.446 and that may
- 15 <u>lead to the safe recovery of the missing adult; and</u>
- 16 (2) a statement instructing any person with
- 17 information related to the missing adult to contact a local law
- 18 enforcement agency.
- 19 Sec. 411.449. TERMINATION OF ALERT. (a) The director shall
- 20 terminate any activation of the alert with respect to a particular
- 21 missing adult not later than the earlier of the date on which:
- 22 (1) the missing adult is located or the situation is
- 23 otherwise resolved; or
- 24 (2) the notification period ends, as determined by
- 25 department rule.
- 26 (b) A local law enforcement agency that locates a missing
- 27 adult who is the subject of an alert under this subchapter shall

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- 1 notify the department as soon as possible that the missing adult has
- 2 been located.
- 3 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
