- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 105.002, Health and Safety Code, is 6 amended by adding Subsections (d) and (e) to read as follows:

(d) To the extent funding is available through fees

- 9 shall establish a social work section for workforce studies within
- 10 the center for the collection and analysis of educational and

- 13 <u>established under Subsection (d) is funded from surcharges</u>
- 14 collected under Section 505.203(d), Occupations Code, the council
- 15 shall provide the Texas State Board of Social Worker Examiners with

- 17 council may expend a reasonable amount of the money to pay the
- 18 administrative costs of maintaining the social work section for
- 19 workforce studies.

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- SECTION 2. Sections 105.003(a), (c-1), (d), and (e), Health

              To the extent feasible, the council shall use a
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researcher with a doctorate in nursing to collect, analyze, and

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- 1 disseminate nursing data that may be used to predict supply and
- 2 demand for nursing personnel in this state using appropriate
- 3 federal or state supply-and-demand models. To the extent feasible,
- 4 the council shall use a researcher with a degree from a master's
- 5 social work program accredited by the Council on Social Work
- 6 Education and a doctorate in social work to collect, analyze, and
- 7 disseminate social work data that may be used to predict supply and
- 8 demand for social work personnel in this state using appropriate
- 9 federal or state supply-and-demand models. The nursing and social
- 10 work data must at least:
- 11 (1) include demographics, areas of practice, supply,
- 12 demand, and migration; and
- 13 (2) be analyzed to identify trends relating to numbers
- 14 and geographical distribution, practice setting, and area of
- 15 practice and, to the extent possible, compare those trends with
- 16 corresponding national trends.
- 17 (e) Data received under this section by the nursing resource
- 18 section or the social work section for workforce studies
- 19 established under Section 105.002 that contains information
- 20 identifying specific patients or health care facilities is
- 21 confidential, is not subject to disclosure under Chapter 552,
- 22 Government Code, and may not be released unless all identifying
- 23 information is removed.
- SECTION 3. Section 105.004(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 25 amended to read as follows:
- 26 (b) The council shall publish reports regarding the data
- 27 collected and analyzed under this chapter related to:

- 1 (1) the educational and employment trends of nursing
- 2 and social work professionals;
- 3 (2) the supply and demand of nursing and social work
- 4 professionals; and
- 5 (3) other issues, as determined necessary by the
- 6 council, concerning nursing or social work professionals in this
- 7 state.
- 8 SECTION 4. Section 505.203, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 9 adding Subsection (d) to read as follows:
- 10 (d) Except as otherwise provided by this subsection, the
- 11 amount of the fee to renew a social worker license is increased by
- 12 \$10. The board may use six cents from the amount of the surcharge
- 13 under this subsection to cover the administrative costs of
- 14 collecting and depositing the surcharge. The board quarterly shall
- 15 transmit the remainder of each surcharge to the Department of State
- 16 Health Services to be used only to fund the social work section for
- 17 workforce studies under Section 105.002, Health and Safety Code.
- 18 The board is not required to collect the surcharge if the board
- 19 determines that the money collected is not appropriated to fund the
- 20 social work section for workforce studies.
- 21 SECTION 5. Section 505.203(d), Occupations Code, as added
- 22 by this Act, applies only to a license renewed on or after the
- 23 effective date of this Act. A license renewed before the effective
- 24 date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the
- 25 license was renewed, and the former law is continued in effect for
- 26 that purpose.
- 27 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
