4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle B, Title 6, Agriculture Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 153 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 153. PREVENTION AND INVESTIGATION OF CATTLE THEFT
8	Sec. 153.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "Association" means the Texas and Southwestern
10	Cattle Raisers Association.
11	(2) "Program" means the inspection program
12	established by department rule under Section 153.002.
13	Sec. 153.002. ESTABLISHMENT OF PROGRAM. (a) The
14	department by rule shall establish a cattle inspection program to
15	discourage and investigate property crimes involving cattle in this
16	state:
17	(1) on request by the association; and
18	(2) if a similar program authorized by federal law is
19	canceled, suspended, repealed, or otherwise scheduled for
20	discontinuation.
21	(b) The program must utilize existing cattle industry
22	infrastructure to the extent possible.
23	Sec. 153.003. INSPECTIONS. Program rules shall authorize
24	the special rangers appointed under Article 2.125, Code of Criminal

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Procedure, and other association employees designated by the 1 special rangers, to inspect and record brands and other identifying 2 characteristics of cattle at livestock auction markets, livestock 3 video and online auctions, and slaughter plants. 4 5 Sec. 153.004. ASSESSMENT. (a) Program rules shall establish a per-head regulatory assessment in an amount necessary 6 7 to reimburse the association for costs incurred under this chapter. (b) In determining the amount of the assessment, the 8 department shall consider: 9 (1) the amount of similar assessments or charges 10 authorized by the laws of other states or the United States; 11 12 (2) the costs of administering the program; and (3) the expertise required to administer the program. 13 (c) On request by the association, the department shall 14 15 review the amount of the assessment and consider any necessary 16 revision. 17 (d) Each livestock auction market, livestock video or online auction, and slaughter plant where inspections are conducted 18 19 under the program shall collect the assessment and remit the amount collected to the association. 20 21 (e) Assessments collected under this section are not state funds and are not required to be deposited in the state treasury. 22 (f) A person who has possession, custody, or control of an 23 24 assessment collected under this section and not remitted to the association before the 31st day after the date collected is subject 25 26 to an administrative penalty in an amount provided by department 27 rule.

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<u>Sec. 153.005.</u> STATE OVERSIGHT. (a) The department shall
 review and approve the association's budget for the program each
 <u>year within 30 days of submittal by the association.</u>

(b) The department or the state auditor may inspect the
association's financial records related to the program at any time.
SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
