5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding
7	Subchapter S-1 to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER S-1. TEXAS GUIDED PATHWAYS PROGRAM
9	Sec. 61.841. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
10	(1) "Program" means the Texas Guided Pathways program
11	established under this subchapter.
12	(2) "Texas OnCourse initiative" means the
13	postsecondary education and career counseling academy developed by

- Sec. 61.842. ESTABLISHMENT OF PROGRAM. (a) The Texas 15 Guided Pathways program is established to inform, empower, and 16 support current and prospective students at institutions of higher 17 18 education by providing those students clear and efficient pathways to completion of undergraduate certificate and degree programs. 19
 - (b) The goals of the program are to:
- 21 (1) provide recommended course sequences for all undergraduate certificate and degree programs offered at 22 23
- institutions of higher education;
- 24 (2) increase the efficiency of transferring course

- 1 credit between two-year and four-year institutions of higher
- 2 education;
- 3 (3) empower students to make well-informed choices by
- 4 making useful course planning information available to students
- 5 electronically;
- 6 (4) decrease the cost of completing undergraduate
- 7 <u>certificate and degree programs by helping students avoid taking</u>
- 8 courses that do not count toward the programs; and
- 9 (5) streamline student pathways to completion of
- 10 undergraduate certificate and degree programs in a manner aligned
- 11 with state goals to increase educational attainment.
- 12 Sec. 61.843. RECOMMENDED COURSE SEQUENCES. (a) Each
- 13 institution of higher education shall develop a recommended course
- 14 sequence for each undergraduate certificate or degree program
- offered by the institution. Each recommended course sequence must:
- 16 (1) be designed to enable a student to obtain a
- 17 certificate or degree, as applicable, within:
- 18 (A) for an associate degree or certificate
- 19 program, four semesters or other academic terms; or
- 20 (B) for a baccalaureate degree program, eight
- 21 <u>semesters or other academic terms;</u>
- 22 (2) include a specific sequence in which courses
- 23 should be completed to ensure completion of the applicable program
- 24 within the time frame described by Subdivision (1); and
- 25 (3) be aligned with the applicable certificate or
- 26 degree requirements published by the institution.
- 27 (b) Not later than June 1 of each year, each institution of

- 1 <u>higher education shall:</u>
- 2 (1) after reviewing and, if necessary, updating each
- 3 recommended course sequence, adopt a version of each recommended
- 4 course sequence to take effect beginning with entering freshmen and
- 5 undergraduate transfer students for the following academic year;
- 6 (2) submit to the board, in an electronic format
- 7 specified by the board, each recommended course sequence and, if
- 8 the institution does not use the common course numbering system,
- 9 information regarding the course equivalent under the common course
- 10 numbering system, if any, for each course included in that course
- 11 sequence; and
- 12 (3) post each recommended course sequence, including
- 13 any information required to be provided under Subdivision (2) for
- 14 that course sequence, on the institution's Internet website in a
- 15 <u>location that is accessible from the institution's website home</u>
- 16 page by use of not more than three links.
- 17 (c) Each institution of higher education shall inform
- 18 students about the recommended course sequences, including how to
- 19 use those course sequences as a tool to aid in course selection, and
- 20 incorporate those course sequences into student advising.
- 21 <u>(d) To enable students to compare recommended course</u>
- 22 sequences at institutions of higher education, each institution of
- 23 <u>higher education shall post on the institution's Internet website a</u>
- 24 link to the web-based platform on recommended course sequences
- 25 developed by the board under Subsection (g).
- 26 (e) After notice to the board, an institution of higher
- 27 education may modify the institution's recommended course

- 1 sequences as necessary to:
- 2 (1) incorporate recommended changes identified as a
- 3 result of any program evaluation conducted by the institution; or
- 4 (2) comply with applicable institutional policies,
- 5 accreditation requirements, and state or federal law.
- 6 (f) An institution of higher education shall honor each
- 7 version of a recommended course sequence adopted by the institution
- 8 under Subsection (b)(1), including any necessary modifications
- 9 made to the course sequence under Subsection (e), for at least the
- 10 four academic years occurring after the date on which that version
- 11 of the course sequence is adopted.
- 12 (g) The board, in consultation with the Texas OnCourse
- 13 initiative and its partnering institutions of higher education,
- 14 shall establish a statewide web-based platform that enables a
- 15 student to:
- 16 (1) search for and compare recommended course
- 17 sequences at institutions of higher education; and
- 18 (2) determine whether a specific lower-division
- 19 course offered by an institution of higher education and identified
- 20 using the common course numbering system would transfer to another
- 21 institution of higher education for course credit applied toward
- 22 the student's undergraduate certificate or degree program and count
- 23 toward that institution's recommended course sequence for that
- 24 program.
- 25 (h) In establishing the web-based platform under Subsection
- 26 (g), the board may use technology platforms provided by the
- 27 National Student Clearinghouse or any other electronic data sharing

- 1 and exchange platforms that meet nationally accepted standards,
- 2 conventions, and practices.
- 3 (i) The board shall ensure that an electronic link to the
- 4 web-based platform established under Subsection (g) is posted on
- 5 the Internet website of any electronic common application system
- 6 developed by the board.
- 7 (j) Not later than November 1 of each even-numbered year,
- 8 the board shall submit to the members of the legislature a report on
- 9 the recommended course sequences at institutions of higher
- 10 education. The report must include an analysis of the alignment of
- 11 courses taken by students in each undergraduate certificate or
- 12 degree program at an institution of higher education with the
- 13 institution's recommended course sequence for that program.
- 14 Sec. 61.844. TRANSFER COMPACTS. (a) Not later than March
- 15 <u>15 of each year, each institution of higher education shall</u> submit
- 16 to the board in an electronic format specified by the board:
- 17 (1) a list of the transfer compacts in which the
- 18 institution participates; and
- 19 (2) a copy of, or an electronic link to a copy of, each
- 20 transfer compact listed under Subdivision (1).
- 21 (b) The board shall provide any necessary support for the
- 22 development of transfer compacts between institutions of higher
- 23 education.
- (c) The board, in consultation with the Texas OnCourse
- 25 initiative and its partnering institutions of higher education,
- 26 shall establish a statewide web-based platform that provides to
- 27 students information regarding transfer compacts between

- 1 institutions of higher education, including an electronic link to
- 2 each transfer compact submitted to the board under Subsection (a).
- 3 (d) In establishing the web-based platform under Subsection
- 4 (c), the board may use technology platforms provided by the
- 5 National Student Clearinghouse or any other electronic data sharing
- 6 and exchange platforms that meet nationally accepted standards,
- 7 conventions, and practices.
- 8 (e) Not later than November 1 of each even-numbered year,
- 9 the board shall submit to the members of the legislature a report on
- 10 transfer compacts between institutions of higher education. The
- 11 report must include an analysis of the impact of those compacts on
- 12 students' efficient progress toward completion of an undergraduate
- 13 certificate or degree program.
- 14 Sec. 61.845. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS. The board may
- 15 solicit and accept gifts, grants, and donations from any public or
- 16 private source for any expenses related to the program.
- 17 Sec. 61.846. RULES. The board, in consultation with
- 18 institutions of higher education:
- 19 (1) shall adopt rules for the electronic submission of
- 20 information required to be submitted to the board under this
- 21 <u>subchapter; and</u>
- (2) may adopt rules as necessary to implement the
- 23 program.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter S-1, Chapter 61, Education Code, as
- 25 added by this Act, applies beginning with the 2018-2019 academic
- 26 year.
- 27 SECTION 3. Notwithstanding Section 61.843(b), Education

- 1 Code, as added by this Act, not later than August 15, 2018, each
- 2 public institution of higher education shall adopt, submit to the
- 3 Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, and post on the
- 4 institution's Internet website the initial recommended course
- 5 sequences as required under that section.
- 6 SECTION 4. Not later than November 1, 2018, the Texas Higher
- 7 Education Coordinating Board shall submit its initial report
- 8 required under Section 61.843(j), Education Code, as added by this
- 9 Act.
- 10 SECTION 5. Not later than March 15, 2019, the Texas Higher
- 11 Education Coordinating Board shall establish the statewide
- 12 web-based platforms required under Sections 61.843(g) and
- 13 61.844(c), Education Code, as added by this Act.
- SECTION 6. Not later than November 1, 2020, the Texas Higher
- 15 Education Coordinating Board shall submit its initial report
- 16 required under Section 61.844(e), Education Code, as added by this
- 17 Act.
- SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
