4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 73, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter J to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER J. COMPETITIVE GRANT PROGRAM TO PROMOTE EARLY LITERACY
8	Sec. 73.701. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
9	(1) "Competitive grant program" means the competitive
10	grant program to promote early literacy established under this
11	subchapter.
12	(2) "Health care practitioner" has the meaning
13	assigned by Section 112.001, Occupations Code.
14	(3) "Health science center" means The University of
15	Texas Health Science Center at Houston.
16	(4) "Literacy program" means a program to promote
17	early literacy.
18	Sec. 73.702. ESTABLISHMENT OF COMPETITIVE GRANT PROGRAM TO
19	PROMOTE EARLY LITERACY. (a) The University of Texas Health Science
20	Center at Houston shall establish a competitive grant program to
21	promote early literacy through which the health science center will
22	award grants for the implementation of literacy programs, or the
23	expansion of existing programs, and for the operation of those
24	programs for a period of not less than two years.

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1 (b) The health science center shall award grants under the program to applicants, including applicants operating existing 2 programs, in a manner that ensures that the literacy programs 3 collectively operate in multiple communities that 4 are 5 geographically distributed throughout this state. 6 Sec. 73.703. LITERACY PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS. A literacy 7 program funded through a grant awarded under this subchapter must: (1) consult and use as a guide the program model 8 developed by the Reach Out and Read National Center, including any 9 clinical, programmatic, and data collection requirements of that 10 model; 11 12 (2) require that health care practitioners who 13 participate in the literacy program: 14 (A) in conjunction with performing well-child 15 examinations, provide books to children and encourage parents to read to their children to develop preliteracy skills; 16 17 (B) maintain waiting rooms that encourage children to read; and 18 19 (C) provide services designed to increase the school readiness of children receiving program services; and 20 21 (3) partner with local adult literacy providers to 22 encourage parent literacy in appropriate circumstances. Sec. 73.704. APPLICATION. (a) A public or private entity, 23 24 including a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of this state, may apply for a grant under this subchapter. 25 26 (b) To apply for a grant, an applicant must submit a written application to the health science center on a form prescribed by the 27

2	National Center.
3	Sec. 73.705. LITERACY PROGRAM GUIDELINES. The health
4	science center, with the assistance of the Reach Out and Read
5	National Center, shall publish guidelines for the literacy programs
6	funded under this subchapter. The guidelines may follow the Reach
7	Out and Read national program model standards and guidelines that
8	have been tested and replicated in multiple communities.
9	Sec. 73.706. USE OF PROGRAM FUNDS. (a) In addition to
10	awarding grants under this subchapter, the health science center
11	may use program funds to:
12	(1) administer the competitive grant program; and
13	(2) purchase or contract to purchase discounted books
14	for use by grant recipients.
15	(b) A grant recipient may use grant funds awarded under this
16	subchapter only to cover costs related to implementing or expanding
17	and operating a literacy program, including costs related to:
18	(1) administering the literacy program;
19	(2) training and managing health care practitioners
20	who volunteer to participate in the literacy program; and
21	(3) purchasing or contracting to purchase discounted
22	books for use in the literacy program.
23	Sec. 73.707. PROGRAM EVALUATION; BIENNIAL COMMITTEE
24	REPORTS. (a) The health science center, with the assistance of
25	the Reach Out and Read National Center, shall prepare and submit a
26	biennial report, not later than December 1 of each even-numbered
27	year, to the senate committee on education, or its successor, and

No. 3775 1 the house public education committee, or its successor, regarding 2 the grants awarded during the preceding two state fiscal years. 3 (b) The report required under Subsection (a) must include: 4 (1) the number of <u>health care practitioners who</u> 5 participate in the program; 6 (2) the number of children receiving literacy program 7 services as a result of the program; and (3) the amount of each grant awarded to a health care 8 practitioner under the program. 9 (c) On request, each grant recipient shall timely collect 10 and provide data and any other information required by the health 11 12 science center to monitor and evaluate the program, including recipient participation in the program, and to prepare the report 13 14 required by this section. 15 Sec. 73.708. COMPETITIVE GRANT PROGRAM FUNDING. (a) The health science center shall actively seek and apply for any 16 17 available federal funds to assist in financing the competitive grant program established under this subchapter. 18 19 (b) The health science center may use appropriated funds from the state government and may accept gifts, donations, grants 20 of money, and in-kind contributions from the federal government, 21 22 local governments, private corporations, or other persons to assist in financing the competitive grant program. 23 24 SECTION 2. The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston shall: 25 (1) as soon as practicable, apply for any available 26 27 federal funds to assist in financing the competitive grant program

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1 under Subchapter J, Chapter 73, Education Code, as added by this 2 Act, as required by Section 73.708, Education Code, as added by this 3 Act; and

4 (2) not later than December 1, 2020, submit a report to
5 the senate committee on education, or its successor, and the house
6 public education committee, or its successor, regarding the
7 implementation and status of the competitive grant program required
8 by Subchapter J, Chapter 73, Education Code, as added by this Act.
9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
