[(b) A law enforcement agency may release to the public a 15 recording described by Subsection (a) if the law enforcement agency 16 determines that the release furthers a law enforcement purpose. 17 18 [(c) This section does not affect the authority of a law enforcement agency to withhold under Section 552.108, Government 19 Code, information related to a closed criminal investigation that 20 21 did not result in a conviction or a grant of deferred adjudication 22 community supervision.] SECTION 2. Section 1701.661, Occupations Code, is amended 23 by adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows: 24

1 (b-1) Before releasing to a member of the public a recording
2 captured by a body worn camera, a law enforcement agency shall
3 obscure or alter relevant portions of the video or audio recording
4 so that only law enforcement officers are identifiable on the
5 recording. The person requesting the recording is responsible for
6 the costs of obscuring or altering the recording under this
7 subsection.
