A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to student loan repayment assistance for certain mental 3 health professionals. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Section 61.601, Education Code, is amended to 5 read as follows: 6 7 Sec. 61.601. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "mental health professional" means: 8 9 (1) a licensed physician who is: (A) a graduate of an accredited psychiatric 10 11 residency training program; or 12 (B) certified in psychiatry by: 13 (i) the American Board of Psychiatry and 14 Neurology; or 15 (ii) the American Osteopathic Board of 16 Neurology and Psychiatry; 17 (2) a psychologist, as defined by Section 501.002, Occupations Code; 18 (3) a licensed professional counselor, as defined by 19 Section 503.002, Occupations Code; 20 21 (4) an advanced practice registered nurse, as defined 22 by Section 301.152, Occupations Code, who holds a nationally recognized board certification in psychiatric or mental health 23 nursing; [and] 24

No. 3808 1 (5) a licensed clinical social worker, as defined by Section 505.002, Occupations Code; and 2 3 (6) a licensed marriage and family therapist, as defined by Section 502.002, Occupations Code. 4 5 SECTION 2. Section 61.607(b), Education Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 7 (b) The total amount of repayment assistance received by a 8 mental health professional under this subchapter may not exceed: 9 (1)\$160,000, for assistance received by a licensed 10 physician; \$80,000, for assistance received by: 11 (2) 12 (A) a psychologist; a licensed clinical social worker, if the 13 (B) social worker has received a doctoral degree related to social 14 15 work; [or] (C) a licensed professional counselor, if the 16 17 counselor has received a doctoral degree related to counseling; or (D) a licensed marriage and family therapist, if 18 19 the marriage and family therapist has received a doctoral degree related to marriage and family therapy; 20 21 \$60,000, for assistance received by an advanced (3) practice registered nurse; and 22 \$40,000, for assistance received by a licensed 23 (4) 24 clinical social worker, a licensed marriage and family therapist, or a licensed professional counselor who is not described by 25 26 Subdivision (2). SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 27

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a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
