A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the establishment of a schedule for the payment of reimbursable claims under the Medicaid managed care program. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 533, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 533.0067 to read as follows: 6 Sec. 533.0067. REQUIRED CONTRACT PROVISIONS; SCHEDULE FOR 7 PAYMENT OF REIMBURSABLE CLAIMS. (a) A managed care organization 8 9 that contracts with the commission to provide health care services to recipients shall establish a schedule for the payment of 10 reimbursable claims that complies with Sections 533.005(a)(7) and 11 (7-a) and include the schedule in a contract between the managed 12 care organization and a health care provider in the managed care 13 14 organization's provider network. (b) If a managed care organization to which this section 15

15 <u>(b)</u> If a managed care organization to which this section 16 applies delegates the payment of reimbursable claims to a third 17 party through a subcontract or otherwise, the third party shall 18 also pay those claims according to the schedule described by 19 <u>Subsection (a).</u>

SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision, the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the

1 waiver or authorization is granted.

SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only 2 to a contract between a managed care organization and a health care 3 provider entered into or renewed on or after the effective date of 4 this Act. A contract between a managed care organization and a 5 6 health care provider entered into or renewed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law applicable to the contract 7 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and that law is 8 continued in effect for that purpose. 9
