## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT
relating to certain requirements of retail fireworks sites and
inspections of those sites and assessment and collection of certain
existing inspection fees by local fire prevention officers.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
SECTION 1. Section 2154.001, Occupations Code, is amended
by adding Subdivisions (9-a), (16-a), and (16-b) to read as
follows:
(9-a) "Indoor retail fireworks site" means a retail
fireworks site, other than a retail fireworks stand, that sells
Fireworks 1.4G from a building or structure.
(16-a) "Retail fireworks site" means a retail location
for which a person has obtained a current retail fireworks permit
under Section 2154.202 to sell fireworks.
(16-b) "Retail fireworks stand" means a structure that
is a retail fireworks site from which Fireworks 1.4G are sold over
the counter to members of the general public who always remain
outside of the structure.
SECTION 2. Subchapter E, Chapter 2154, Occupations Code, is
amended by adding Section 2154.2025 to read as follows:
Sec. 2154.2025. INSPECTION OF RETAIL FIREWORKS SITES. (a)
In this section:
(1) "Fire or life safety hazard" has the meaning
assigned by Section 352.016, Local Government Code.

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1	(2) "Local fire prevention officer" means:
2	(A) a county fire marshal; or
3	(B) a fire prevention officer of an emergency
4	services district.
5	(b) A local fire prevention officer may inspect a retail
6	fireworks site for a fire or life safety hazard and assess and
7	collect an inspection fee under Section 352.016, Local Government
8	Code, or Section 775.040, Health and Safety Code, as applicable,
9	for that inspection if:
10	(1) the local fire prevention officer is authorized to
11	conduct the inspection under Chapter 352, Local Government Code, or
12	Chapter 775, Health and Safety Code, as applicable; and
13	(2) the local fire prevention officer is:
14	(A) a county fire marshal of the county in which
15	the site is located; or
16	(B) a fire prevention officer of an emergency
17	services district in which the site is located provided:
18	(i) the county in which the site is located
19	has not appointed a county fire marshal; or
20	(ii) the county fire marshal of the county
21	in which the site is located requests the fire prevention officer to
22	conduct the inspection.
23	(c) A local fire prevention officer who inspects a retail
24	fireworks site for a fire or life safety hazard as authorized by
25	Chapter 352, Local Government Code, or Chapter 775, Health and
26	Safety Code, as applicable, may assess the inspection fee provided
27	by Section 352.016, Local Government Code, or by Section 775.040,

1	Health and Safety Code, as applicable, and collect payment of that
2	fee from the person who obtained a retail fireworks permit under
3	Section 2154.202 to sell fireworks at the site. The inspection fee
4	may not exceed:
5	(1) \$100, if the largest building at the site is less
6	than 25,000 square feet, plus \$25 for each additional building,
7	other than the largest building, located at the site;
8	(2) \$200, if the largest building at the site is 25,000
9	square feet or more, but less than 100,000 square feet, plus \$25 for
10	each additional building, other than the largest building, located
11	at the site; and
12	(3) \$300, if the largest building at the site is
13	100,000 square feet or more, plus \$25 for each additional building,
14	other than the largest building, located at the site.
15	(d) An inspection fee under Section 352.016, Local
16	Government Code, or Section 775.040, Health and Safety Code, as
17	applicable, may be assessed and collected for the inspection of a
18	retail fireworks site for a fire or life safety hazard only:
19	(1) once in a calendar year for that site; and
20	(2) by a local fire prevention officer authorized
21	under Subsection (b) to inspect the site for a fire or life safety
22	hazard and to assess and collect an inspection fee.
23	(e) A local fire prevention officer who inspects a retail
24	fireworks site for a fire or life safety hazard may determine
25	whether the site complies with the requirements of Sections
26	2154.221 and 2154.222.
27	(f) Except as otherwise provided by Subsection (e), this

1	section does not grant additional authority to a local fire
2	prevention officer.
3	(g) This section does not limit the authority of a local
4	fire prevention officer to conduct an inspection of a retail
5	fireworks site for a fire or life safety hazard more than once in a
6	calendar year provided that the site is assessed an inspection fee
7	not more than once in that calendar year and the inspection complies
8	with other requirements of this section.
9	(h) To the extent of any conflict between this section and
10	Chapter 352, Local Government Code, or Chapter 775, Health and
11	Safety Code, this section controls.
12	SECTION 3. Chapter 2154, Occupations Code, is amended by
13	adding Subchapter E-1 to read as follows:
14	SUBCHAPTER E-1. INDOOR RETAIL FIREWORKS SITES
15	Sec. 2154.221. FIREWORKS SALES BUILDING. The fireworks
16	sales building of an indoor retail fireworks site must be a
17	freestanding durable structure with only one story of the building
18	accessible to the public. The fireworks sales building of an indoor
19	retail fireworks site may not be:
20	(1) a tent, boat, or mobile vehicle; or
21	(2) part of a multiuse or multi-tenant building.
22	Sec. 2154.222. SALES DISPLAY AREA. The sales display area
23	of an indoor retail fireworks site must be sufficiently designed to
24	prevent customers from handling fireworks unless an attendant is
25	directly assisting the customer.
26	Sec. 2154.223. OFFICE AREA EXEMPTION. The commissioner may
27	exempt the office area used in the operation of an indoor retail

1 <u>fireworks site from commissioner rules prescribing distance</u> 2 <u>requirements between fireworks storage and inhabited buildings if,</u> 3 <u>after inspecting the office area at the request of the permit holder</u> 4 <u>for the site, the state fire marshal confirms and reports to the</u> 5 <u>commissioner that the office area is separated by a one-hour</u> 6 <u>fire-rated wall from any fireworks sales or storage area.</u> 7 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives

8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
