A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to retainage requirements for certain public works

- 3 construction projects.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Subchapter B, Chapter 2252,
- 6 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 SUBCHAPTER B. [INTEREST ON] RETAINED PUBLIC WORKS CONTRACT PAYMENTS
- 8 SECTION 2. Section 2252.031, Government Code, is amended by
- 9 amending Subdivision (5) and adding Subdivisions (6) and (7) to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 (5) "Retainage" means the part of a:
- 12 <u>(A)</u> public works contract payment withheld by a
- 13 governmental entity to secure performance of the contract; or
- 14 (B) payment under a public works contract
- 15 withheld by a prime contractor or subcontractor to secure
- 16 performance of any work that is required of the prime contractor
- 17 under the contract that a subcontractor contracts to perform.
- 18 (6) "Subcontractor" means a person who contracts with
- 19 <u>a prime contractor or any other subcontractor to provide labor or</u>
- 20 materials to fulfill an obligation of the prime contractor under a
- 21 public works contract.
- 22 (7) "Warranty period" means the period of time
- 23 specified in a contract during which certain terms applicable to
- 24 the warranting of work performed under the contract are in effect.

- 1 SECTION 3. Section 2252.032, Government Code, is amended to
- 2 read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 2252.032. RETAINAGE <u>WITHHELD BY GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY</u>.
- 4 (a) A governmental entity shall:
- 5 (1) include in each public works contract to which the
- 6 governmental entity is a party a provision that establishes, for
- 7 the project that is the subject of the contract:
- 8 (A) the circumstances under which the project
- 9 will be considered substantially complete; and
- 10 (B) if retainage will be released on substantial
- 11 completion of the project and, if so, the percentage of the amount
- 12 of retainage that will be released on substantial completion;
- 13 (2) deposit in an interest-bearing account the
- 14 retainage of a [public works contract that provides for retainage
- 15 of more than five percent of the] periodic contract payment of a
- 16 public works contract; and
- 17 (3) $\left[\frac{(2)}{2}\right]$ pay the retainage remaining in the account
- 18 described by Subdivision (2), including any interest earned on the
- 19 retainage, to the prime contractor on completion of the contract.
- 20 (b) If the total value of a public works contract is \$1
- 21 <u>million or more</u>, a governmental entity:
- (1) may not withhold retainage in an amount that
- 23 exceeds five percent of the contract price;
- 24 (2) may release retainage for completed portions of
- 25 the work; and
- 26 (3) may release a portion of the retainage on
- 27 substantial completion of the project.

1 (c) A governmental entity may not withhold retainage: 2 (1) after completion of the contract by the prime 3 contractor, including during any warranty period after completion 4 of the contract; or 5 (2) for the purpose of requiring the prime contractor, after completion of the contract, to perform work on manufactured 6 7 goods or systems that were: 8 (A) specified by the designer of record; and (B) properly installed by the contractor. 9 10 SECTION 4. Subchapter B, Chapter 2252, Government Code, is 11 amended by adding Section 2252.0325 to read as follows: 12 Sec. 2252.0325. RETAINAGE WITHHELD BY PRIME CONTRACTOR OR SUBCONTRACTOR. (a) If, for the purpose of fulfilling an obligation 13 14 of the prime contractor under a public works contract, a prime 15 contractor enters into a subcontract that has a total value of at 16 least \$250,000: 17 (1) the prime contractor may not withhold from a subcontractor a greater percentage of retainage than the percentage 18 19 being withheld from the prime contractor by the governmental entity under the public works contract; and 20 21 (2) a subcontractor who enters into a contract with another subcontractor to provide labor or materials under the 22 public works contract may not withhold from that subcontractor a 23 24 greater percentage of retainage than the percentage that may be withheld from the subcontractor as determined under Subdivision 25 (1)<u>.</u> 26

(b) A prime contractor who receives a payment of interest

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- 1 under Section 2252.032 shall pay to any subcontractor of the prime
- 2 contractor from whom the prime contractor has withheld retainage
- 3 under a public works contract a proportionate share of the interest
- 4 the prime contractor receives in an amount based on the ratio of the
- 5 amount of retainage withheld by the prime contractor from the
- 6 subcontractor to the amount of retainage withheld by the
- 7 governmental entity from the prime contractor.
- 8 <u>(c) A subcontractor who receives a payment of interest under</u>
- 9 this section shall pay to any contracting subcontractor from whom
- 10 the subcontractor withheld retainage a proportionate share of the
- 11 <u>interest the subcontractor receives in an amount based on the ratio</u>
- 12 of the amount of retainage withheld by the subcontractor from the
- 13 contracting subcontractor to the amount of retainage withheld from
- 14 the subcontractor by the prime contractor or by another
- 15 <u>subcontractor</u>, as applicable.
- SECTION 5. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 17 a contract to which Subchapter B, Chapter 2252, Government Code,
- 18 applies that is entered into on or after the effective date of this
- 19 Act. A contract to which Subchapter B, Chapter 2252, Government
- 20 Code, applies that is entered into before the effective date of this
- 21 Act is governed by the law in effect when the contract was entered
- 22 into, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 23 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
