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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to requiring a voter to present proof of identification. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 31, Election Code, is 4 5 amended by adding Section 31.013 to read as follows: 6 Sec. 31.013. MOBILE LOCATIONS FOR OBTAINING IDENTIFICATION. (a) The secretary of state shall establish a 7 program using mobile units to provide election identification 8 9 certificates to voters for the purpose of satisfying the requirements of Section 63.001(b). A mobile unit may be used at 10 special events or at the request of a constituent group. 11 12 (b) In establishing the program, the secretary of state shall consult with the Department of Public Safety on the creation 13 14 of the program, security relating to the issuance of an election identification certificate, best practices in issuing an election 15 identification certificate, and equipment required to issue an 16 election identification certificate. 17 (c) The secretary of state may not charge a fee to a group 18 that requests a mobile unit established under this section. 19 (d) If the secretary of state cannot ensure the required 20 security or other necessary elements of the program, the secretary 21 22 of state may deny a request for a mobile unit established under this 23 section. (e) The secretary of state shall adopt rules necessary for 24

1 the implementation of this section. 2 SECTION 2. Subchapter E, Chapter 31, Election Code, is 3 amended by adding Section 31.125 to read as follows: 4 Sec. 31.125. ELECTION IDENTIFICATION CERTIFICATES. (a) The 5 county clerk shall provide a location at the county clerk's office and at each subcourthouse located in the county for the Department 6 7 of Public Safety to issue an election identification certificate under Section 521A.001, Transportation Code, during all regular 8 business hours. 9 10 (b) The secretary of state shall negotiate an agreement that the Department of Public Safety and each county clerk shall enter 11 into for the purpose of issuing election identification 12 certificates under this section. 13 SECTION 3. Section 63.001, Election Code, is amended by 14 amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsections (c-1) and (i) to 15 read as follows: 16 17 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (h), on offering to vote, a voter must present to an election officer at the polling 18 19 place: 20 (1) one form of photo identification listed in [described by] Section 63.0101(a); or 21 22 (2) one form of identification listed in Section 23 63.0101(b) accompanied by the declaration described by Subsection 24 (i) [63.0101]. (c-1) An election officer may not refuse to accept 25 26 documentation presented to meet the requirements of Subsection (b) solely because the address on the documentation does not match the 27

1	address on the list of registered voters.
2	(i) If the requirement for identification prescribed by
3	Subsection (b)(1) is not met, an election officer shall notify the
4	voter that the voter may be accepted for voting if the voter meets
5	the requirement for identification prescribed by Subsection (b)(2)
6	and executes a declaration under penalty of perjury declaring the
7	voter's identity. The secretary of state shall prescribe the
8	following form of the affidavit:

2	another state [that has not expired or that expired no earlier than
3	60 days before the date of presentation];
4	(2) a United States military identification card that
5	contains the person's photograph [that has not expired or that
6	expired no earlier than 60 days before the date of presentation];
7	(3) a United States citizenship certificate issued to
8	the person that contains the person's photograph;
9	(4) a United States passport issued to the person
10	[that has not expired or that expired no earlier than 60 days before
11	the date of presentation]; [or]
12	(5) a license to carry a handgun issued to the person
13	by the Department of Public Safety;
14	(6) an election identification certificate issued to
15	the person by the Department of Public Safety;
16	(7) a valid identification card that contains the
17	person's photograph and is issued by:
18	(A) an agency or institution of the federal
19	government; or
20	(B) an agency, institution, or political
21	subdivision of any state;
22	(8) a photo identification card issued to the person
23	by a municipal, county, or state governmental entity or the United
24	States for the purpose of obtaining public benefits, including
25	veteran's benefits, Medicaid, or Medicare;
26	(9) an official Native American tribal document that:
27	(A) contains the person's photograph; and

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1	(B) is issued by a tribe that is federally
2	recognized;
3	(10) a student identification card issued by an
4	institution of higher education or a private or independent
5	institution of higher education as those terms are defined by
6	Section 61.003, Education Code, that contains the person's
7	photograph; or
8	(11) a United States Department of Veterans Affairs
9	identification card, including a Veteran Health Identification
10	Card, that contains the person's photograph [that has not expired
11	or that expired no earlier than 60 days before the date of
12	presentation].
13	(b) The following documentation is acceptable as proof of
14	identification under this chapter:
15	(1) a government document that shows the name and
16	address of the voter, including the voter's voter registration
17	<pre>certificate;</pre>
18	(2) one of the following documents that shows the name
19	and address of the voter:
20	(A) a copy of a current utility bill;
21	(B) a bank statement;
22	(C) a government check; or
23	(D) a paycheck; or
24	(3) a certified copy of a domestic birth certificate
25	or other document confirming birth that is admissible in a court of
26	law and establishes the person's identity.
27	(c) A person 70 years of age or older may use a form of

1	identification listed in Subsection (a) that has expired for the
2	purposes of voting if the identification is otherwise valid.
3	(d) Except as provided by Subsection (c), a form of
4	acceptable identification listed by Subsection (a) that has not
5	expired or expired not earlier than four years before the date of
6	presentation may be used as an acceptable form of photo
7	identification if the identification is otherwise valid.
8	SECTION 5. Section 65.0541(a), Election Code, is amended to
9	read as follows:
10	(a) A voter who is accepted for provisional voting under
11	Section 63.011 because the voter does not meet the identification
12	requirements of Section 63.001(b) may, not later than the sixth day
13	after the date of the election:
14	(1) present [a form of identification described by
15	Section 63.0101] to the voter registrar for examination:
16	(A) a form of identification described by Section
17	<u>63.0101(a); or</u>
18	(B) a form of identification described by Section
19	63.0101(b) accompanied by the declaration described by Section
20	<u>63.001(i)</u> ; or
21	(2) execute an affidavit described by Section
22	65.054(b)(2)(B) or (C) in the presence of the voter registrar.
23	SECTION 6. Section 272.011(b), Election Code, is amended to
24	read as follows:
25	(b) The secretary of state shall prepare the translation for
26	election materials required to be provided in a language other than
27	English or Spanish for the following state prescribed voter forms:

Section 13.002; 2 3 (2) the confirmation form required by Section 15.051; 4 (3) the voting instruction poster required by Section 5 62.011; 6 (4) the declaration of voter's identity required by 7 Section 63.001(b); 8 (5) the statement of residence form required by Section 63.0011; 9 10 (6) [(5)] the provisional ballot affidavit required by Section 63.011; 11 12 (7) [(6)] the application for a ballot by mail required by Section 84.011; 13 14 (8) [(7)] the carrier envelope and voting instructions required by Section 86.013; and 15 (9) [(8)] any other voter forms that the secretary of 16 17 state identifies as frequently used and for which state resources are otherwise available. 18 SECTION 7. Section 521A.001(a), Transportation Code, 19 is amended to read as follows: 20 21 (a) The department shall issue an election identification certificate to a person who states that the person is obtaining the 22 23 certificate for the purpose of satisfying Section 63.001(b), 24 Election Code, and does not have another form of identification described by Section 63.0101(a) [63.0101], Election Code, and: 25 26 (1) who is a registered voter in this state and presents a valid voter registration certificate; or 27

(1) voter registration application form required by

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1 (2) who is eligible for registration under Section 2 13.001, Election Code, and submits a registration application to 3 the department.

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4 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect January 1, 2018.
