A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to requiring a referendum regarding the use of

3 photographic traffic signal enforcement systems.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Chapter 707, Transportation Code, is amended by 6 adding Section 707.020 to read as follows:

7 Sec. 707.020. REFERENDUM FOR PHOTOGRAPHIC TRAFFIC SIGNAL

8 ENFORCEMENT SYSTEM. (a) Before a local authority may operate a

9 photographic traffic signal enforcement system at a location in the

10 <u>authority's jurisdiction</u>, the local authority must hold a

11 referendum on whether the local authority may operate a

12 photographic traffic signal enforcement system at that location. At

13 the election the ballots shall be printed to permit voting for or

14 against the following proposition: "The operation of a photographic

15 traffic signal enforcement system by (name of local authority)."

16 The ballot must contain a description of each location where a

17 photographic traffic signal enforcement system would be located.

18 (b) If a majority of the votes cast are in favor of the

19 proposition, the local authority may operate a photographic traffic

20 signal enforcement system at each location described on the ballot.

21 If less than a majority of the votes cast are in favor of the

22 proposition, the local authority may not operate a photographic

23 traffic signal enforcement system at any location described on the

24 ballot.

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- 1 (c) A subsequent referendum under this section:
- 2 (1) may be held more than once;
- 3 (2) may authorize operation of the system at
- 4 <u>additional locations;</u>
- 5 (3) is held in the same manner as the initial
- 6 referendum; and
- 7 (4) may not be held before the second anniversary of an
- 8 election previously held under this section.
- 9 SECTION 2. (a) A local authority, as defined by Section
- 10 707.001, Transportation Code, that operates a photographic traffic
- 11 signal enforcement system, as defined by Section 707.001,
- 12 Transportation Code, on the effective date of this Act shall hold
- 13 the referendum required by Section 707.020, Transportation Code, as
- 14 added by this Act, on the first uniform election date that occurs
- 15 after the effective date of this Act on whether the local authority
- 16 may continue to operate the system.
- 17 (b) A local authority described by Subsection (a) of this
- 18 section may not operate a photographic traffic signal enforcement
- 19 system at a location other than the locations in place on the
- 20 effective date of this Act unless approved at a referendum held
- 21 under Section 707.020, Transportation Code, as added by this Act.
- (c) A local authority that fails to authorize a photographic
- 23 traffic signal enforcement system under a referendum held under
- 24 Subsection (a) of this section that has entered into a contract for
- 25 the administration and enforcement of the system before the
- 26 effective date of this Act may continue to operate the system under
- 27 the terms of that contract until the expiration date specified in

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- 1 the contract as the contract existed on the effective date of this
- 2 Act.
- 3 (d) Subsection (c) of this section does not apply to a
- 4 contract for the administration and enforcement of a photographic
- 5 traffic signal enforcement system entered into before the effective
- 6 date of this Act that explicitly authorizes termination of the
- 7 contract on the basis of adverse state legislation.
- 8 (e) On or after the effective date of this Act and before the
- 9 date of a referendum held under Subsection (a) of this section, a
- 10 local authority described by Subsection (a) of this section may not
- 11 enter into a new contract for the administration and enforcement of
- 12 a photographic traffic signal enforcement system, extend an
- 13 existing contract for the administration and enforcement of a
- 14 photographic traffic signal enforcement system, or relocate an
- 15 existing photographic traffic signal enforcement system.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
