A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
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- 2 relating to the creation of a task force on intentional violent
- 3 deaths.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. In this Act:
- 6 (1) "Department" means the Department of State Health
- 7 Services.
- 8 (2) "Task force" means the task force on intentional
- 9 violent deaths.
- 10 SECTION 2. (a) The department shall establish a task force
- 11 on intentional violent deaths. The task force shall develop a
- 12 written plan establishing measures and a timeline to reduce
- 13 intentional violent deaths in this state, including suicides and
- 14 homicides. The department shall:
- 15 (1) analyze current available local and state data
- 16 relating to intentional violent deaths and:
- 17 (A) identify gaps in the data; and
- 18 (B) recommend measures to improve data
- 19 collection;
- 20 (2) analyze, to the extent feasible, the impact mental
- 21 illness has on intentional violent deaths;
- 22 (3) review current laws in this state and other states
- 23 pertaining to addressing and preventing intentional violent
- 24 deaths; and

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- 1 (4) review national best practices relating to
- 2 policies on reducing intentional violent deaths.
- 3 (b) The task force is composed of 11 members as follows:
- 4 (1) two members appointed by the governor;
- 5 (2) one member appointed by the lieutenant governor;
- 6 (3) one member appointed by the speaker of the house of 7 representatives;
- 8 (4) one representative of each of the following 9 agencies appointed by the executive head of the agency:
- 10 (A) the department;
- 11 (B) the Department of Public Safety of the State
- 12 of Texas;
- 13 (C) the Texas Department of Criminal Justice; and
- 14 (D) the Texas Suicide Prevention Council;
- 15 (5) one representative from a law enforcement
- 16 organization, appointed by the commissioner of state health
- 17 services; and
- 18 (6) two representatives from public health advocacy
- 19 organizations, appointed by the department.
- 20 (c) A task force member is not entitled to compensation or
- 21 reimbursement for expenses incurred in performing the member's
- 22 duties.
- 23 (d) Not later than October 1, 2017, each person responsible
- 24 for appointing members to the task force shall appoint the members
- 25 as required by Subsection (b) of this section.
- 26 (e) Not later than December 1, 2018, the task force shall
- 27 submit its written plan to the governor and members of the

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- 1 legislature.
- 2 SECTION 3. The task force is abolished and this Act expires
- 3 September 1, 2019.
- 4 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
