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A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

1-22 development relating to staff and continuing education 1-23 requirements for public school educators regarding digital 1-24 education methods. 1-25

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 21.001, Education Code, is amended to read as follows:

1-27 DEFINITIONS [DEFINITION]. In this chapter: mmissioner" [, "commissioner"] includes 1-28 Sec. 21.001. 1-29 (1) "Commissioner" includes а person designated by the commissioner. 1-30

"Digital learning" means any type of learning that 1-31 (2) facilitated by technology or instructional practice that makes 1-32 1-33

SECTION 7. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 3-12 3-13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 3-14 3-15 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
