H.B. No. 4068

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to regional or local health care programs for eligible 3 individuals and employees of small employers. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 75, Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 CHAPTER 75. REGIONAL OR LOCAL HEALTH CARE PROGRAMS FOR ELIGIBLE 7 INDIVIDUALS AND EMPLOYEES OF SMALL EMPLOYERS 8 SECTION 2. Section 75.001, Health and Safety Code, 9 is amended to read as follows: 10 Sec. 75.001. PURPOSE. The purpose of this chapter is to: 11 12 (1)improve the health of eligible individuals and employees of small employers and their families by improving the 13 14 individuals' and employees' access to health care and by reducing the number of those individuals and employees who are uninsured; 15 (2) reduce the likelihood that those individuals and 16 employees and their families will require services from 17 state-funded entitlement programs such as Medicaid; 18 (3) contribute to economic development by helping 19 20 small businesses remain competitive with a healthy workforce and 21 optional health care benefits that will attract employees; and 22 (4) encourage innovative solutions for providing and 23 funding health care services and benefits. SECTION 3. Section 75.002, Health and Safety Code, 24 is

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1 amended by amending Subdivisions (1), (3), and (4) and adding
2 Subdivision (1-a) to read as follows:

3 (1) <u>"Eligible individual" means an individual</u>
4 <u>eligible for participation in a regional or local health care</u>
5 <u>program established under this chapter.</u>

6 <u>(1-a)</u> "Employee" means an individual employed by an 7 employer. The term includes a partner of a partnership and the 8 proprietor of a sole proprietorship.

9 (3) "Local health care program" means a local health 10 care program operating in one county and established for the 11 benefit of <u>eligible individuals and</u> the employees of small 12 employers under Subchapter B.

13 (4) "Regional health care program" means a regional 14 health care program operating in two or more counties and 15 established for the benefit of <u>eligible individuals and</u> the 16 employees of small employers under Subchapter B.

SECTION 4. Sections 75.052 and 75.053, Health and Safety
Code, are amended to read as follows:

Sec. 75.052. GOVERNANCE OF PROGRAM. (a) [A regional health care program may be operated subject to the direct governance of the commissioners courts of the participating counties. A local health care program may be operated subject to the direct governance of the commissioners court of the participating county.] A regional or commissioners court of the participating county.] A regional or local health care program <u>must</u> [may] be operated by a [joint council,] tax-exempt nonprofit entity[, or other entity that:

26 [(1) operates the program under a contract with the 27 commissioners court or courts, as applicable; or

1 [(2) is an entity in which the county or counties 2 participate or that is established or designated by the 3 commissioners court or courts, as applicable, to operate the 4 program].

5 (b) <u>An</u> [In selecting an] entity <u>operating</u> [described by 6 <u>Subsection (a)(1) or (2) to operate</u>] a regional or local health care 7 program <u>must</u> [, the commissioners court or courts, as applicable, 8 <u>shall require</u>, to the extent possible, that the entity] be 9 authorized under federal law to accept donations on a basis that is 10 tax-deductible or otherwise tax-advantaged for the contributor.

Sec. 75.053. OPERATION OF PROGRAM. A regional or local 11 health care program provides health care services or benefits to 12 eligible individuals and the employees of participating small 13 14 employers who are located within the boundaries of the 15 participating county or counties, as applicable. A program may also provide services or benefits to the dependents of those 16 17 individuals and employees.

SECTION 5. Subchapter B, Chapter 75, Health and Safety
Code, is amended by adding Section 75.0545 to read as follows:

20 <u>Sec. 75.0545. PARTICIPATION BY ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS; SHARE</u> 21 <u>OF COST. Subject to Section 75.153, the governing body may</u> 22 <u>establish criteria for participation in a regional or local health</u> 23 <u>care program by eligible individuals and their dependents. The</u> 24 <u>criteria must require that participating individuals pay a share of</u> 25 <u>the premium or other cost of the program.</u>

26 SECTION 6. Section 75.055(c), Health and Safety Code, is 27 amended to read as follows:

(c) A governing body shall actively solicit gifts, grants,
 and donations to:

3 (1) fund services and benefits provided under the4 regional or local health care program; and

5 (2) reduce the cost of participation in the program 6 <u>for eligible individuals and</u> for small employers and their 7 employees.

8 SECTION 7. Section 75.101, Health and Safety Code, is 9 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 75.101. ALTERNATIVE PROGRAMS 10 AUTHORIZED; PROGRAM OBJECTIVES. In developing a regional or local health care program, 11 12 a governing body may provide health care services or benefits as described by this subchapter or may develop another type of program 13 14 to accomplish the purposes of this chapter. A regional or local health care program must be developed, to the extent practicable, 15 16 to:

(1) reduce the number of individuals without health benefit plan coverage [within the boundaries of the participating county or counties];

20 (2) address rising health care costs and reduce the
21 cost of health care services or health benefit plan coverage [for
22 small employers and their employees within the boundaries of the
23 participating county or counties];

(3) promote preventive care and reduce the incidence
of preventable health conditions, such as heart disease, cancer,
and diabetes and low birth weight in infants;

27 (4) promote efficient and collaborative delivery of

1 health care services;

(5) serve as a model for the innovative use of health information technology to promote efficient delivery of health care services, reduce health care costs, and improve the health of the community; and

6 (6) provide fair payment rates for health care 7 providers, to the extent applicable.

8 SECTION 8. Sections 75.102(a), (c), and (d), Health and 9 Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:

10 (a) A regional or local health care program may provide 11 health care benefits to <u>eligible individuals and</u> the employees of 12 small employers by purchasing or facilitating the purchase of 13 health benefit plan coverage for those <u>individuals and</u> employees 14 from a health benefit plan issuer, including coverage under:

15 (1) a small employer health benefit plan offered under16 Chapter 1501, Insurance Code;

17 (2) a standard health benefit plan offered under18 Chapter 1507, Insurance Code; or

19 (3) any other health benefit plan available in this20 state.

21 (c) Notwithstanding Chapter 1251, Insurance Code, an insurer may issue a group accident and health insurance policy, 22 including a group contract issued by a group hospital service 23 24 corporation, to cover eligible individuals and the employees of small employers participating in a regional or local health care 25 26 program. The group policyholder of a policy issued in accordance with this subsection is the governing body or the designee of the 27

1 governing body.

(d) A health maintenance organization may issue a health
care plan to cover <u>eligible individuals and</u> the employees of small
employers participating in a regional or local health care program.
The group contract holder of a contract issued in accordance with
this subsection is the governing body or the designee of the
governing body.

8 SECTION 9. Sections 75.104(a) and (c), Health and Safety 9 Code, are amended to read as follows:

10 (a) A regional or local health care program may contract 11 with health care providers within the boundaries of the 12 participating county or counties to provide health care services 13 directly to <u>eligible individuals</u>, the employees of participating 14 small employers, and the dependents of those <u>individuals and</u> 15 employees.

16 (c) A governing body that operates a regional or local 17 health care program under this section may require that participating eligible individuals, employees, and dependents 18 19 obtain health care services only from health care providers that contract to provide those services under the program and may limit 20 the health care services provided under the program to services 21 provided within the boundaries of the program's service area 22 23 [participating county or counties].

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SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
