- 2 relating to reporting requirements for and the availability of
- 3 information regarding certain uses of force, injuries, or deaths
- 4 caused by peace officers.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. The heading to Article 2.139, Code of Criminal
- 7 Procedure, as added by Chapter 516 (H.B. 1036), Acts of the 84th
- 8 Legislature, Regular Session, 2015, is amended to read as follows:
- 9 Art. 2.139. REPORTS AND INFORMATION REGARDING [REQUIRED
- 10 FOR] OFFICER-INVOLVED USES OF FORCE, INJURIES, OR DEATHS.
- 11 SECTION 2. Article 2.139(a), Code of Criminal Procedure, as
- 12 added by Chapter 516 (H.B. 1036), Acts of the 84th Legislature,
- 13 Regular Session, 2015, is amended by amending Subdivision (2) and
- 14 adding Subdivision (3) to read as follows:
- 15 (2) "Officer-involved injury or death" means an
- 16 officer-involved use of force that causes [incident during which a
- 17 peace officer discharges a firearm causing] injury or death to
- 18 another.
- 19 (3) "Officer-involved use of force" means an incident
- 20 during which a peace officer uses an action or force to compel
- 21 compliance by an unwilling person.
- 22 SECTION 3. Article 2.139, Code of Criminal Procedure, as
- 23 added by Chapter 516 (H.B. 1036), Acts of the 84th Legislature,
- 24 Regular Session, 2015, is amended by amending Subsection (b) and

- 1 adding Subsections (b-1) and (f) to read as follows:
- 2 (b) The office of the attorney general by rule shall create
- 3 a written and electronic form for the recording [reporting] by law
- 4 enforcement agencies of information concerning an officer-involved
- 5 use of force [injury or death]. The form must include spaces to
- 6 $\underline{\text{record}}$ [$\underline{\text{report}}$] only the following information:
- 7 (1) the date on which the incident occurred;
- 8 (2) the location where the incident occurred;
- 9 (3) the age, gender, <u>name</u>, and race or ethnicity of
- 10 each peace officer involved in the incident;
- 11 (4) [if known,] the age, gender, name, and race or
- 12 ethnicity of each person against whom force was used [injured or
- 13 deceased person involved] in the incident, including a description
- 14 of any injuries sustained by the person;
- 15 (5) a detailed description of the use of force,
- 16 including a description of the use by a peace officer of a deadly
- 17 weapon;
- 18 (6) whether the person against whom force was used
- 19 [was injured or] died as a result of the incident;
- 20 <u>(7)</u> [(6)] <u>a description of whether <u>and how</u> each</u>
- 21 [$\frac{injured or deceased}{}$] person $\frac{against whom force was}{}$ used[τ]
- 22 exhibited $[\tau]$ or was carrying a deadly weapon during the incident;
- 23 (8) [(7)] whether each peace officer involved in the
- 24 incident was on duty during the incident;
- (9) $[\frac{(8)}{(8)}]$ whether each peace officer involved in the
- 26 incident was responding to an emergency call or a request for
- 27 assistance and, if so, whether the officer responded to that call or

- 1 request with one or more other peace officers; and
- 2 (10) [(9)] whether the incident occurred during or as
- 3 a result of:
- 4 (A) the execution of a warrant; or
- 5 (B) a hostage, barricade, or other emergency
- 6 situation.
- 7 (b-1) As soon as practicable after an officer-involved use
- 8 of force, the law enforcement agency employing an officer involved
- 9 in the incident must record the information described by Subsection
- 10 (b) regarding the incident.
- 11 (f) Notwithstanding any other law, information described by
- 12 Subsection (b) is public information under Chapter 552, Government
- 13 Code, is not confidential, is not excepted from required
- 14 disclosure, and must be disclosed in response to a request under
- 15 that chapter. A governmental body must disclose the information
- 16 regardless of whether the information is held in a personnel
- 17 record, law enforcement record, or other record maintained by or on
- 18 behalf of the governmental body.
- 19 SECTION 4. Article 2.139(f), Code of Criminal Procedure, as
- 20 added by this Act, applies only to a request for information
- 21 received by a governmental body or an officer for public
- 22 information on or after the effective date of this Act. A request
- 23 for information received before the effective date of this Act is
- 24 governed by the law in effect when the request was received, and the
- 25 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- SECTION 5. Not later than October 1, 2017, the office of the
- 27 attorney general shall adopt rules to implement Article 2.139(b),
