A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to authorization by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board for certain public junior colleges to offer 3 baccalaureate degree programs. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Chapter 130, Education Code, is amended by 7 adding Subchapter L, and a heading is added to that subchapter to read as follows: 8 9 SUBCHAPTER L. BACCALAUREATE DEGREE PROGRAMS SECTION 2. Section 130.0012(1), Education Code, 10 is transferred to Subchapter L, Chapter 130, Education Code, as added 11 by this Act, redesignated as Section 130.301, Education Code, and 12 amended to read as follows: 13 14 Sec. 130.301. DEFINITIONS. [(1)] In this subchapter: (1) "Coordinating <u>board</u>" means the Texas Higher 15 16 Education Coordinating Board. (2) "General academic teaching institution," "medical 17 [section, "general academic teaching and dental unit," 18 institution"] and "institution of higher education" have the 19 20 meanings assigned by Section 61.003. 21 SECTION 3. Section 130.0012(a), Education Code, is transferred to Subchapter L, Chapter 130, Education Code, as added 22 23 by this Act, redesignated as Section 130.302, Education Code, and 24 amended to read as follows:

1 Sec. 130.302. BACCALAUREATE DEGREE PROGRAMS; GENERAL [(a)] The coordinating board may [Texas Higher 2 AUTHORIZATION. Education Coordinating Board shall] authorize public 3 junior colleges to offer baccalaureate degree programs as provided by this 4 subchapter [in the fields of applied science and applied technology 5 under this section]. Offering a baccalaureate degree program under 6 this subchapter [section] does not otherwise alter the role and 7 8 mission of a public junior college.

9 SECTION 4. Section 130.0012(b), Education Code, is 10 transferred to Subchapter L, Chapter 130, Education Code, as added 11 by this Act, redesignated as Section 130.303, Education Code, and 12 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 130.303. AUTHORIZATION FOR CERTAIN BACCALAUREATE DEGREE PROGRAMS. (a) [(b)] The coordinating board shall authorize baccalaureate degree programs <u>in the fields of applied science and</u> <u>applied technology</u> at each public junior college that previously participated in a pilot project to offer <u>those</u> baccalaureate degree programs.

19 (b) The coordinating board may authorize baccalaureate 20 degree programs at one or more public junior colleges that offer a 21 degree program in the field of applied science, applied technology, 22 or nursing and have demonstrated a workforce need.

SECTION 5. Sections 130.0012(b-1), (b-2), and (b-3), Education Code, are transferred to Subchapter L, Chapter 130, Education Code, as added by this Act, redesignated as Section 130.304, Education Code, and amended to read as follows:

27 Sec. 130.304. BACCALAUREATE IN DENTAL HYGIENE; PILOT

1 PROJECT. (a) [(b-1)] The coordinating board shall establish a pilot project to examine the feasibility and effectiveness of 2 3 authorizing baccalaureate degree programs in the field of dental hygiene at a public junior college that offers a degree program in 4 that field, has a main campus located in the county seat of a county 5 with a population greater than 200,000, and includes territory in 6 at least six public school districts located in two counties. 7 Section 130.310 [Subsection (g)] does not apply to junior-level and 8 senior-level courses offered under this section [subsection]. 9 In 10 its recommendations to the legislature relating to state funding for public junior colleges, the coordinating board shall recommend 11 that junior-level and senior-level courses offered under this 12 section [subsection] by a public junior college receive the same 13 14 state support as other courses offered by the public junior 15 college.

<u>(b)</u> [(b=2)] Not later than 2017, 16 January 1, the 17 coordinating board shall prepare a progress report on the pilot project established under this section [Subsection (b-1)]. 18 Not later than January 1, 2019, the coordinating board shall prepare a 19 report on the effectiveness of the pilot project, including any 20 recommendations for legislative action regarding the offering of 21 baccalaureate degree programs in the field of dental hygiene by a 22 public junior college. The coordinating board shall deliver a copy 23 24 of each report to the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, and the chair of the 25 26 standing committee of each house of the legislature with primary jurisdiction over higher education. Unless the authority to 27

1 continue offering a baccalaureate degree program in the field of 2 dental hygiene is continued by the legislature, a public junior 3 college may not:

4 (1) enroll a new student in a baccalaureate degree
5 program under the pilot project after the 2019 fall semester;

6 (2) offer junior-level or senior-level courses for 7 those degree programs after the 2021 fall semester, unless the 8 coordinating board authorizes the college to offer those courses; 9 or

10 (3) award a baccalaureate degree under the pilot 11 project after the 2021 fall semester, unless the coordinating board 12 approves the awarding of the degree.

13 (c) [(b=3)] This section expires [subsection and 14 Subsections (b-1) and (b-2) expire] on the first June 15 following 15 the first regular legislative session that occurs after the fourth anniversary of the date a public junior college offering a degree 16 17 program in the field of dental hygiene under this section [Subsection (b-1)] meets the accreditation requirements of Section 18 19 130.305 [Subsection (c)].

20 SECTION 6. Section 130.0012(c), Education Code, is 21 transferred to Subchapter L, Chapter 130, Education Code, as added 22 by this Act, redesignated as Section 130.305, Education Code, and 23 amended to read as follows:

24 <u>Sec. 130.305. ACCREDITATION.</u> [(c)] A public junior college 25 offering a baccalaureate degree program under this <u>subchapter</u> 26 [section] must meet all applicable accreditation requirements of 27 the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges

1 and Schools.

2 SECTION 7. Section 130.0012(d), Education Code, is 3 transferred to Subchapter L, Chapter 130, Education Code, as added 4 by this Act, redesignated as Section 130.306, Education Code, and 5 amended to read as follows:

<u>Sec. 130.306. LIMITATION. (a)</u> [(d)] A public junior
college offering a baccalaureate degree program under <u>Section</u>
<u>130.303(a)</u> [this section] may not offer more than five
baccalaureate degree programs at any time.

10 <u>(b) Except as provided by Subsection (a), a public junior</u> 11 <u>college offering a baccalaureate degree program under this</u> 12 <u>subchapter may not offer more than three baccalaureate degree</u> 13 programs at any time.

<u>(c) Degree</u> [The degree] programs <u>offered under this</u>
 <u>subchapter</u> are subject to the continuing approval of the
 coordinating board.

17 SECTION 8. Section 130.0012(e), Education Code, is 18 transferred to Subchapter L, Chapter 130, Education Code, as added 19 by this Act, redesignated as Section 130.307, Education Code, and 20 amended to read as follows:

21 <u>Sec. 130.307. REQUIREMENTS. (a)</u> [(e)] In determining 22 <u>whether a public junior college may offer</u> [what] baccalaureate 23 degree programs <u>and what degree programs may</u> [are to] be offered, 24 the coordinating board shall<u>:</u>

(1) apply the same criteria and standards the
 coordinating board uses to approve baccalaureate degree programs at
 general academic teaching institutions and medical and dental

1 units; and 2 (2) consider the following factors: 3 (A) [(1)] the workforce need for the degree programs in the region served by the junior college; 4 5 (B) [(2)] how those degree programs would complement the other programs and course offerings of the junior 6 college and whether the associate degree program offered by the 7 8 junior college in the same field has been successful; 9 (C) [(3)] whether those degree programs would 10 unnecessarily duplicate the degree programs offered by other institutions of higher education; and 11 (D) [(4)] the ability of the junior college to 12 support the degree programs with student enrollment [program] and 13 14 adequacy of the junior college's facilities, faculty, the 15 administration, libraries, and other resources. (b) A public junior college may offer a baccalaureate degree 16 program under this section only if its junior college district: 17 (1) had a taxable property valuation amount of not 18 19 less than \$6 billion in the preceding year; and (2) received a positive assessment of the overall 20 financial health of the district as reported by the coordinating 21 22 board. (c) Before a public junior college may be authorized to 23 24 offer a baccalaureate degree program under this subchapter, the public junior college must submit a report to the coordinating 25 26 board that includes: 27 (1) a long-term financial plan for receiving

1	accreditation from the Commission on Colleges of the Southern
2	Association of Colleges and Schools;
3	(2) a long-term plan for faculty recruitment that:
4	(A) indicates the ability to pay the increased
5	salaries of doctoral faculty;
6	(B) identifies recruitment strategies for new
7	faculty; and
8	(C) ensures the program would not draw faculty
9	employed by a neighboring institution offering a similar program;
10	(3) detailed information on the manner of program and
11	course delivery; and
12	(4) detailed information regarding existing
13	articulation agreements and dual enrollment agreements indicating:
14	(A) that at least three articulation agreements
15	have been established with general academic teaching institutions
16	or medical and dental units, or the reasons why no articulation
17	agreements have been established; and
18	(B) that, with the agreement of the applicable
19	general academic teaching institution or medical and dental unit,
20	established articulation agreements are at capacity.
21	(d) The coordinating board may not authorize a public junior
22	college to offer a baccalaureate degree in a field if articulation
23	agreements with general academic teaching institutions or medical
24	and dental units are sufficient to meet the needs of that field.
25	SECTION 9. Subchapter L, Chapter 130, Education Code, as
26	added by this Act, is amended by adding Section 130.308, Education
27	Code, to read as follows:

1 Sec. 130.308. SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS FOR NURSING DEGREE PROGRAM. (a) In determining whether a public junior college may 2 3 offer a baccalaureate degree program in nursing, the coordinating 4 board shall: 5 (1) require a public junior college to provide evidence to the coordinating board and the Texas Board of Nursing 6 7 that the public junior college has secured adequate long-term 8 clinical space; 9 (2) obtain a letter from each clinical site provided indicating that the clinical site has not refused a similar request 10 from a general academic teaching institution or medical and dental 11 12 unit; and (3) establish that the corresponding associate degree 13 14 program offered by the public junior college has been successful as 15 indicated by job placement rates and licensing exam scores. (b) A baccalaureate degree program offered under this 16 17 subchapter by a public junior college in the field of nursing must: 18 (1) be a bachelor of science degree program; 19 (2) meet the standards and criteria the Texas Board of Nursing uses to approve pre-licensure degree programs at general 20 academic teaching institutions and medical and dental units 21 regardless of whether the program is a pre-licensure or 22 23 post-licensure program; and 24 (3) be accredited by a national nursing accrediting body recognized by the United States Department of Education. 25 26 (c) A public junior college offering a baccalaureate degree program in the field of nursing under this subchapter must 27

demonstrate to the coordinating board that it will maintain or exceed the enrollment available to nursing students enrolled in an associate degree program at the public junior college in the 2016-2017 academic year and must continue to maintain or exceed that level of enrollment in the corresponding associate degree program until the 2021-2022 academic year. This subsection expires January 1, 2023.

8 SECTION 10. Sections 130.0012(f) and (j), Education Code, 9 are transferred to Subchapter L, Chapter 130, Education Code, as 10 added by this Act, redesignated as Section 130.309, Education Code, 11 and amended to read as follows:

12 Sec. 130.309. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT REQUIRED. (a) [(f)] Each public junior college that offers a baccalaureate degree 13 program under this subchapter [section] must enter into an 14 articulation agreement for the first five years of the program with 15 one or more general academic teaching institutions or medical and 16 17 dental units to ensure that students enrolled in the degree program have an opportunity to complete the degree if the public junior 18 19 college ceases to offer the degree program. The coordinating board may require a general academic teaching institution or medical and 20 <u>dental unit</u> that offers a comparable degree program to enter into an 21 articulation agreement with the public junior college as provided 22 by this subsection. 23

(b) [(j)] The coordinating board shall prescribe procedures to ensure that each public junior college that offers a degree program under this <u>subchapter</u> [section] informs each student who enrolls in the degree program of the articulation agreement entered

C.S.H.B. No. 4092 1 into under <u>this section</u> [Subsection (f)] for the student's degree 2 program.

3 SECTION 11. Section 130.0012(g), Education Code, is 4 transferred to Subchapter L, Chapter 130, Education Code, as added 5 by this Act, redesignated as Section 130.310, Education Code, and 6 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 130.310. FUNDING. (a) Except as provided by 7 8 Subsection (b), a degree program created under this subchapter may be funded solely by a public junior college's proportionate share 9 of state appropriations under Section 130.003, local funds, and 10 private sources. This subsection does not require the legislature 11 12 to appropriate state funds to support a degree program created under this subchapter. The coordinating board shall weigh contact 13 14 hours attributable to students enrolled in a junior-level or 15 senior-level course offered under this subchapter used to determine a public junior college's proportionate share of state 16 17 appropriations under Section 130.003 in the same manner as a lower division course in a corresponding field. 18

(b) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), in [(g) In] 19 its recommendations to the legislature relating to state funding for 20 public junior colleges, the coordinating board shall recommend that 21 a public junior college authorized to offer baccalaureate degree 22 programs under Section 130.303(a) receive substantially the same 23 24 state support for junior-level and senior-level courses in the fields of applied science and applied technology offered under this 25 26 subchapter [section] as that provided to a general academic teaching institution for substantially similar courses. 27 For

1 purposes of this subsection, in [In] determining the contact hours attributable to students enrolled in a junior-level or senior-level 2 3 course in the field of applied science or applied technology offered under this subchapter [section] used to determine a public 4 junior college's proportionate share of state appropriations under 5 Section 130.003, the coordinating board shall weigh those contact 6 hours as necessary to provide the junior college the appropriate 7 8 level of state support to the extent state funds for those courses are included in the appropriations. This subsection does not 9 10 prohibit the legislature from directly appropriating state funds to support junior-level and senior-level courses to which this 11 12 subsection applies [offered under this section].

13 (c) A public junior college may not charge a student 14 enrolled in a baccalaureate degree program offered under this 15 subchapter tuition and fees in an amount that exceeds the amount of 16 tuition and fees charged by the junior college to a similarly 17 situated student who is enrolled in an associate degree program in a 18 corresponding field.

19 SECTION 12. Section 130.0012(h), Education Code, is 20 transferred to Subchapter L, Chapter 130, Education Code, as added 21 by this Act, redesignated as Section 130.311, Education Code, and 22 amended to read as follows:

23 <u>Sec. 130.311. REPORT. Each biennium, each [(h) Each]</u> 24 public junior college offering a baccalaureate degree program under 25 this section shall <u>conduct a review of each baccalaureate degree</u> 26 <u>program offered and prepare a [biennial]</u> report on the operation<u>,</u> 27 <u>quality</u>, and effectiveness of <u>those</u> [the junior college's

1 baccalaureate] degree programs. A [and shall deliver a] copy of the 2 report shall be delivered to the coordinating board in the form and 3 at the time determined by the coordinating board.

4 SECTION 13. Section 130.0012(k), Education Code, is 5 transferred to Subchapter L, Chapter 130, Education Code, as added 6 by this Act, redesignated as Section 130.312, Education Code, and 7 amended to read as follows:

8 <u>Sec. 130.312. RULES.</u> [(k)] The coordinating board shall 9 adopt rules as necessary for the administration of this <u>subchapter</u> 10 [section].

SECTION 14. The heading to Section 130.0012, Education Code, is repealed.

13 SECTION 15. This Act takes effect immediately if it 14 receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each 15 house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. 16 If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate 17 effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
