A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to a foster children's bill of rights. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 263.008(b), Family Code, is amended by 4 5 to read as follows: 6 It is the policy of this state that each child in foster (b) 7 care be informed of the child's rights provided by state or federal law or policy that relate to: 8 9 (1)abuse, neglect, exploitation, discrimination, and harassment, which includes discrimination and harassment based on 10 gender, gender identity, race, ethnicity, religion, national 11 12 origin, disability, medical problems or sexual orientation; 13 food, clothing, shelter, and education; (2) 14 (3) medical, dental, vision, and mental health services, including the right of the child to consent to treatment; 15 16 (4) emergency behavioral intervention, including what methods are permitted, the conditions under which it may be used, 17 and the precautions that must be taken when administering it; 18 (5) placement with the child's siblings and contact 19 20 with members of the child's family; 21 (6) privacy and searches, including the use of storage space, mail, and the telephone; 22 participation in school-related extracurricular 23 (7) 24 or community activities;

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(2) limits a foster child's rights to choose a
religion, or attend religious services or activities of the child's
choosing, which includes the choice not to practice a religion.
SECTION 3. Section 263.008(h), Family Code, is repealed.
SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

Act takes effect September 1, 2017.

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
