4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Sections 33.202(a) and (c), Education Code, are
6	amended to read as follows:
7	(a) The <u>University Interscholastic League</u> [commissioner by
8	rule] shall develop and adopt an extracurricular activity safety
9	training program as provided by this section. In developing the
10	program, the <u>University Interscholastic League</u> [commissioner] may
11	use materials available from the American Red Cross, Emergency
12	Medical Systems (EMS), or another appropriate entity.
13	(c) The safety training program must include:
14	(1) certification of participants by the American Red
15	Cross, the American Heart Association, or a similar organization
16	[or the University Interscholastic League], as determined by the
17	<pre>University Interscholastic League [commissioner];</pre>
18	(2) current training in:
19	(A) emergency action planning;
20	(B) cardiopulmonary resuscitation if the person
21	is not required to obtain certification under Section 33.086;
22	(C) communicating effectively with 9-1-1
23	emergency service operators and other emergency personnel; and

(D) recognizing symptoms of potentially

- 1 catastrophic injuries, including head and neck injuries,
- 2 concussions, injuries related to second impact syndrome, asthma
- 3 attacks, heatstroke, cardiac arrest, and injuries requiring use of
- 4 a defibrillator; and
- 5 (3) at least once each school year, a safety drill that
- 6 incorporates the training described by Subdivision (2) and
- 7 simulates various injuries described by Subdivision (2)(D).
- 8 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2017-2018
- 9 school year.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
