A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to training for law enforcement officers and officials;
- 3 authorizing a fee.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1701.253, Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 by amending Subsections (c), (h), and (j) and adding Subsection (n)
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (c) As part of the minimum curriculum requirements, the
- 9 commission shall establish a statewide comprehensive education and
- 10 training program on civil rights, racial sensitivity, implicit
- 11 bias, and cultural diversity for persons licensed under this
- 12 chapter.
- 13 (h) As part of the minimum curriculum requirements, the
- 14 commission shall establish a statewide comprehensive education and
- 15 training program on racial profiling for officers licensed under
- 16 this chapter. An officer shall complete a program established
- 17 under this subsection not later than the first [second] anniversary
- 18 of the date the officer is licensed under this chapter or the date
- 19 the officer applies for an intermediate proficiency certificate,
- 20 whichever date is earlier.
- 21 (j) As part of the minimum curriculum requirements, the
- 22 commission shall require an officer to complete a 40-hour statewide
- 23 education and training program on de-escalation and crisis
- 24 intervention techniques to facilitate interaction with persons

- 1 with mental impairments. An officer shall complete the program not
- 2 later than the first [second] anniversary of the date the officer is
- 3 licensed under this chapter or the date the officer applies for an
- 4 intermediate proficiency certificate, whichever date is earlier.
- 5 An officer may not satisfy the requirements of this subsection
- 6 [section] or Section 1701.402(g) by taking an online course on
- 7 de-escalation and crisis intervention techniques to facilitate
- 8 interaction with persons with mental impairments.
- 9 (n) As part of the minimum curriculum requirements, the
- 10 commission shall require an officer to complete a statewide
- 11 education and training program on de-escalation techniques to
- 12 <u>facilitate interaction with members of the public, including</u>
- 13 <u>techniques for limiting the use of force. An officer shall complete</u>
- 14 the program not later than the first anniversary of the date the
- 15 officer is licensed under this chapter or the date the officer
- 16 applies for an intermediate proficiency certificate, whichever
- 17 date is earlier. An officer may not satisfy the requirements of
- 18 this subsection or Section 1701.402(n) by taking an online course.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 1701.310, Occupations Code, is amended
- 20 by adding Subsections (f) to read as follows:
- 21 (f) A person assigned by the sheriff to the chief command
- 22 position overseeing a county jail shall within 90 days of being
- 23 <u>assigned to the chief command position overseeing a county jail</u>
- 24 pass the chief command position exam.
- 25 (1) If a person assigned to the chief command position
- 26 overseeing a county jail fails the chief command position exam they
- 27 shall be immediately removed, and be unable to be reinstated until

- 1 they pass the chief command position exam.
- 2 (2) A person who fails the chief command position exam
- 3 must wait a minimum of 90 days to retake the exam.
- 4 (3) The Sheriff of the County in which the jail is
- 5 located shall hold the chief command position until a new person is
- 6 appointed, or the person originally assigned has passed the chief
- 7 command position exam.
- 8 SECTION 3. Section 1701.352, Occupations Code, is amended
- 9 by amending Subsections (b) and (e) and adding Subsection (j) to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 (b) The commission shall require a state, county, special
- 12 district, or municipal agency that appoints or employs peace
- 13 officers to provide each peace officer with a training program at
- 14 least once every 48 months that is approved by the commission and
- 15 consists of:
- 16 (1) topics selected by the agency; and
- 17 (2) for an officer holding only a basic proficiency
- 18 certificate, not more than 20 hours of education and training that
- 19 contain curricula incorporating the learning objectives developed
- 20 by the commission regarding:
- 21 (A) civil rights, racial sensitivity, <u>implicit</u>
- 22 bias, and cultural diversity;
- 23 (B) de-escalation and crisis intervention
- 24 techniques to facilitate interaction with persons with mental
- 25 impairments; [and]
- 26 (C) de-escalation techniques to facilitate
- 27 interaction with members of the public, including techniques for

1 limiting the use of force; and

- 2 (D) unless determined by the agency head to be
- 3 inconsistent with the officer's assigned duties:
- 4 (i) the recognition and documentation of
- 5 cases that involve child abuse or neglect, family violence, and
- 6 sexual assault; and
- 7 (ii) issues concerning sex offender
- 8 characteristics.
- 9 (e) The commission may require a state, county, special
- 10 district, or municipal agency that appoints or employs a reserve
- 11 law enforcement officer, county jailer, or public security officer
- 12 to provide each of those persons with education and training in
- 13 civil rights, racial sensitivity, <u>implicit bias</u>, and cultural
- 14 diversity at least once every 48 months.
- 15 <u>(j) The education and training program on de-escalation</u>
- 16 techniques to facilitate interaction with members of the public
- 17 under Subsection (b)(2)(C) may not be provided as an online course.
- SECTION 4. Section 1701.402, Occupations Code, is amended
- 19 by amending Subsection (i) and adding Subsection (n) to read as
- 20 follows:
- 21 (i) As a requirement for an intermediate proficiency
- 22 certificate, an officer must complete an education and training
- 23 program on civil rights, racial sensitivity, implicit bias, and
- 24 cultural diversity established by the commission under Section
- 25 1701.253(c).
- 26 (n) As a requirement for an intermediate proficiency
- 27 certificate or an advanced proficiency certificate, an officer must

- 1 complete the education and training program regarding
- 2 de-escalation techniques to facilitate interaction with members of
- 3 the public established by the commission under Section 1701.253(n).
- 4 SECTION 5. Section 1701.310, Occupations Code, is amended
- 5 by amending Subsections (a) to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 1701.310. APPOINTMENT OF COUNTY JAILER; TRAINING
- 7 REQUIRED. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (e), a person may
- 8 not be appointed as a county jailer, except on a temporary basis,
- 9 unless the person has satisfactorily completed a preparatory
- 10 training program which includes 24 hours of training to facilitate
- 11 interaction with persons with mental impairments, as required by
- 12 the commission, in the operation of a county jail at a school
- 13 operated or licensed by the commission.
- 14 SECTION 6. Chapter 511, Government Code, is amended by
- 15 adding Section 511.00905 to read as follows:
- Sec. 511.00905. CHIEF COMMAND POSITION; EXAMINATION
- 17 REQUIRED. (a) The commission shall approve an examination for a
- 18 person assigned to the chief command position overseeing a county
- 19 jail.
- 20 (b) The commission shall adopt rules requiring a person,
- 21 other than a sheriff, assigned to the chief command position
- 22 overseeing a county jail to pass the examination not later than the
- 23 90th day after the date the person is assigned to that position.
- 24 The rules must provide that a person who fails the examination:
- 25 (1) shall be immediately removed from the position and
- 26 may not be reinstated until the person passes the examination; and
- 27 (2) may not retake the examination before the 91st day

- 1 after the date of the failed examination.
- 2 (c) The sheriff of a county shall perform the duties of the
- 3 chief command position at any time there is not a person available
- 4 who satisfies the examination requirements of this section.
- 5 (d) The commission shall provide for the examination to be
- 6 available at testing centers throughout this state. If the
- 7 commission contracts with a testing service to administer and grade
- 8 the examination, the contract shall authorize the service to
- 9 collect a reasonable fee not to exceed \$50 from each examinee.
- 10 SECTION 7. Section 1701.310, Occupations Code, is amended
- 11 by adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 12 (a-1) A person other than a sheriff may not serve in the
- 13 chief command position of a county jail unless the person satisfies
- 14 the examination requirement of Section 511.00905, Government Code.
- SECTION 8. Not later than January 1, 2018, the Sam Houston
- 16 State University College of Criminal Justice shall develop and the
- 17 Commission on Jail Standards shall approve the examination required
- 18 by Section 511.00905, Government Code, as added by this Act.
- 19 SECTION 9. Section 1701.310(a-1), Occupations Code, as
- 20 added by this Act, takes effect January 1, 2018.
- 21 SECTION 10. Not later than January 1, 2018, the Texas
- 22 Commission on Law Enforcement shall establish or modify training
- 23 programs as necessary to comply with Section 1701.253, Occupations
- 24 Code, as amended by this article.
- 25 SECTION 11. Except as otherwise provided by this Act, this
- 26 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
