A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 1 AN ACT
- 2 relating to mental health first aid training for university
- 3 employees.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1001.201, Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Subdivision (6) to read as follows:
- 7 (6) "University employee" means a person employed by a
- 8 public or private institution of higher education who regularly
- 9 interacts with students enrolled at the university through the
- 10 course of the person's duties.
- 11 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 1001.203, Health and
- 12 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 1001.203. GRANTS FOR TRAINING CERTAIN UNIVERSITY
- 14 EMPLOYEES, SCHOOL DISTRICT EMPLOYEES, AND SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS
- 15 [EDUCATORS] IN MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID.
- 16 SECTION 3. Sections 1001.203(a), (c), and (e), Health and
- 17 Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 18 (a) To the extent funds are appropriated to the department
- 19 for that purpose, the department shall make grants to local mental
- 20 health authorities to provide an approved mental health first aid
- 21 training program, administered by mental health first aid trainers,
- 22 at no cost to <u>university employees</u>, school district employees, and
- 23 school resource officers.
- (c) The department shall grant \$100 to a local mental health

- 1 authority for each university employee, school district employee,
- 2 or school resource officer who successfully completes a mental
- 3 health first aid training program provided by the authority under
- 4 this section.
- 5 (e) A local mental health authority may contract with a
- 6 regional education service center to provide a mental health first
- 7 aid training program to <u>university employees</u>, school <u>district</u>
- 8 employees, and school resource officers [educators] under this
- 9 section.
- SECTION 4. The heading to Section 1001.2031, Health and
- 11 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 1001.2031. SUPPLEMENTAL GRANTS FOR TRAINING CERTAIN
- 13 UNIVERSITY EMPLOYEES, SCHOOL DISTRICT EMPLOYEES, AND SCHOOL
- 14 RESOURCE OFFICERS [EDUCATORS] IN MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID.
- 15 SECTION 5. Section 1001.205, Health and Safety Code, is
- 16 amended to read as follows:
- Sec. 1001.205. REPORTS. (a) Not later than September 30
- 18 of each year, a local mental health authority shall provide to the
- 19 department the number of:
- 20 (1) employees and contractors of the authority who
- 21 were trained as mental health first aid trainers under Section
- 22 1001.202 during the preceding fiscal year;
- 23 (2) <u>university employees</u> [educators], school district
- 24 employees [other than educators], and school resource officers who
- 25 completed a mental health first aid training program offered by the
- 26 authority under Section 1001.203 during the preceding fiscal year;
- 27 and

- 1 (3) individuals who are not university employees,
- 2 school district employees, or school resource officers who
- 3 completed a mental health first aid training program offered by the
- 4 authority during the preceding fiscal year.
- 5 (b) Not later than December 1 of each year, the department
- 6 shall compile the information submitted by local mental health
- 7 authorities as required by Subsection (a) and submit a report to the
- 8 legislature containing the number of:
- 9 (1) authority employees and contractors trained as
- 10 mental health first aid trainers during the preceding fiscal year;
- 11 (2) <u>university employees</u> [educators], school district
- 12 employees [other than educators], and school resource officers who
- 13 completed a mental health first aid training program provided by an
- 14 authority during the preceding fiscal year; and
- 15 (3) individuals who are not university employees,
- 16 school district employees, or school resource officers who
- 17 completed a mental health first aid training program provided by an
- 18 authority during the preceding fiscal year.
- 19 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
