## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the authorization of certain carriers to transport 3 liquor; authorizing a fee. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Chapter 41, Alcoholic Beverage Code, is amended 5 to read as follows: 6 7 Chapter 41. CARRIER PERMIT/PACKAGE STORE CARRIER PERMIT Sec. 41.01. AUTHORIZED ACTIVITIES OF A CARRIER PERMIT. 8 (a) The holder of a carrier permit may only transport liquor into and 9 out of this state and between points within the state. 10 11 (b) The holder of a carrier permit may transport liquor from 12 one wet area to another wet area across a dry area if that course of transportation is necessary or convenient. 13 14 (c) The holder of a carrier permit who transports liquor to the premises of a wholesaler, including to a location from which the 15 wholesaler is temporarily conducting business under Section 16 109.62, shall provide to the consignee a shipping invoice that 17 clearly states: 18 (1) the and address 19 name of the consignor and 20 consignee; 21 (2) the origin and destination of the shipment; and 22 (3) any other information required by this code or 23 commission rule, including the brands, sizes of containers, types, 24 and quantities of liquor contained in the shipment.

2	or package store carrier permit is \$30.
3	Sec. 41.03. ELIGIBILITY FOR <u>A CARRIER PERMIT/PACKAGE STORE</u>
4	<u>CARRIER PERMIT</u> . (a) A carrier permit may be issued to:
5	(1) a water carrier;
6	(2) an airline;
7	<pre>(3) a railway;</pre>
8	(4) a motor carrier registered under Chapter 643,
9	Transportation Code; [ <del>or</del> ]
10	(5) a [ <del>common carrier operating under a certificate</del>
11	issued by the Interstate Commerce Commission.] motor carrier with
12	operating authority or MC registration granted by the Federal Motor

23	Sec. 41.05. TRANSPORTATION OF WINE OUT OF STATE. At the
24	request of a holder of a winery permit, a common carrier that does
25	not hold a carrier permit may transport wine from the premises of
26	the holder of the winery permit or from another location where the
27	holder of a winery permit may legally store wine to a destination

1 out of this state, if the common carrier may otherwise legally 2 transport wine and the holder of the winery permit furnishes to the 3 commission any documentation required by the commission concerning 4 the transportation and the receipt of the wine at the destination 5 out of this state.

Sec. 41.06. PACKAGE STORE CARRIER PERMIT. (a) The holder
of a package store carrier permit is considered a "retailer" for
purposes of Section 102.01 of this code.

9 <u>(b) A package store carrier permittee may not knowingly</u> 10 <u>utilize or employ any person under the age of 21 to make deliveries</u> 11 <u>of alcohol.</u>

12 (c) The holder of a package store carrier permit who 13 provides transportation and delivery services to more than one 14 holder of a permit under Chapter 22 or Chapter 24 of this code must 15 also provide similar transportation and delivery services to 16 businesses that do not have permits under Chapter 22 or Chapter 24.

17 <u>Sec. 41.07. AUTHORIZED ACTIVITIES OF A PACKAGE STORE</u> 18 <u>CARRIER PERMIT. The holder of a package store carrier permit may</u> 19 <u>transport and deliver liquor to the ultimate consumer on behalf of a</u> 20 <u>package store or wine only package store that holds a local cartage</u> 21 <u>permit under the same terms and conditions in Section 22.03 of this</u> 22 <u>code that are applicable to transport or delivery by the holder of</u> 23 <u>the package store permit or wine only package store permit.</u>

24 <u>Sec. 41.08. VEHICLES USED BY PACKAGE STORE CARRIER</u> 25 <u>PERMITTEE. (a) No package store carrier permittee may transport</u> 26 <u>liquor unless each vehicle has been plainly marked or lettered to</u> 27 <u>indicate that it is being used for the transportation of liquor by a</u>

1	the package store carrier permittee.
2	(b) The transportation of liquor by a package store carrier
3	permittee in a vehicle not described and marked in accordance with
4	this section is a violation of this code and is grounds for
5	cancellation of the permit.
6	Sec. 41.09. IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS. (a) Alcohol
7	transported and delivered by a holder of a package store carrier
8	permit may not be delivered to any person other than:
9	(1) the person who purchased the alcohol;
10	(2) a recipient designated in advance by such
11	purchaser; or
12	(3) a person at the delivery address who is age 21 or
13	over.
14	(b) Alcohol may be delivered only to a person who is age 21
15	or over after the person accepting the package:
16	(1) presents valid proof of identity and age; and
17	(2) personally signs a receipt acknowledging delivery
18	of the package.
19	SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2017.
