3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
4	SECTION 1. Sections 152.0821(a) and (b), Human Resources
5	Code, are amended to read as follows:
6	(a) Fisher County is included in the 32nd Judicial District
7	Juvenile Board [Fisher, Mitchell, and Nolan counties juvenile
8	board. The juvenile board is composed of:
9	[(1) a county judge from Fisher, Mitchell, or Nolar
10	County elected by a majority vote of the county judges from those
11	counties;
12	[(2) the 32nd Judicial District judge or the judge of
13	the county court at law in Nolan County who is selected by agreement
14	between those two judges;
15	[(3) one person appointed by the Nolan County
16	Commissioners Court;
17	[(4) subject to Subsection (f), the city manager of
18	Sweetwater or another person appointed by the Sweetwater City
19	Commission;
20	[(5) subject to Subsection (g), the superintendent of
21	the Sweetwater Independent School District or another person
22	appointed by the board of trustees of the Sweetwater Independent
23	School District;
24	[(6) one person appointed by the Mitchell County

Commissioners Court; [(7) one person appointed by the Fisher County 2 3 Commissioners Court; 4 [(8) the county attorney of Fisher, Mitchell, or Nolan 5 County selected by a majority vote of the county judges of those counties; and 6 [(9) one person selected by majority vote of the 7 8 county judges of Fisher, Mitchell, and Nolan counties, subject to confirmation by a vote of the commissioners courts of each of those counties]. 10 (b) Section 152.1831 applies to the 32nd Judicial District 11 Juvenile Board. [The chairman of the board is the county judge 12 appointed under Subsection (a)(1). The chairman presides at 13 meetings scheduled by the board. 14 15 SECTION 2. Sections 152.1741(a) and (b), Human Resources Code, are amended to read as follows: 16 (a) Mitchell County is included in the 32nd Judicial 17 District Juvenile Board [Fisher, Mitchell, and Nolan counties 18 juvenile board. The juvenile board is composed of: 19 20 [(1) a county judge from Fisher, Mitchell, or Nolan 21 County elected by a majority vote of the county judges from those 22 counties; [(2) the 32nd Judicial District judge or the judge of 23 24 the county court at law in Nolan County who is selected by agreement between those two judges; 25 26 [(3) one person appointed by the Nolan County

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Commissioners Court;

[(4) subject to Subsection (f), the city manager of 1 Sweetwater or another person appointed by the Sweetwater City 2 Commission; 3 4 [(5) subject to Subsection (q), the superintendent of the Sweetwater Independent School District or another person 5 appointed by the board of trustees of the Sweetwater Independent 6 School District; 7 8 [(6) one person appointed by the Mitchell County 9 Commissioners Court; 10 [(7) one person appointed by the Fisher County Commissioners Court; 11 [(8) the county attorney of Fisher, Mitchell, or Nolan 12 County selected by majority vote of the county judges of those 13 counties; and 14 15 [(9) one person selected by majority vote of the county judges of Fisher, Mitchell, and Nolan counties, subject to 16 17 confirmation by a vote of the commissioners courts of each of those counties]. 18 Section 152.1831 applies to the 32nd Judicial District 19 Juvenile Board. [The chairman of the board is the county judge 20 appointed under Subsection (a)(1). The chairman presides at 21 meetings scheduled by the board. 22 SECTION 3. Section 152.1831, Human Resources Code, 23 24 amended to read as follows: Sec. 152.1831. NOLAN COUNTY. (a) Nolan County is included 25 in the 32nd Judicial District Juvenile Board [Fisher, Mitchell, and 26

Nolan counties juvenile board]. The juvenile board is composed of

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1 the county judges, statutory county judges, and district judges in Fisher, Mitchell, and Nolan counties[+ 2 [(1) a county judge from Fisher, Mitchell, or Nolan 3 County elected by a majority vote of the county judges from those 4 5 counties; [(2) the 32nd Judicial District judge or the judge of 6 7 the county court at law in Nolan County who is selected by agreement 8 between those two judges; [(3) one person appointed by the Nolan County 9 Commissioners Court; 10 [(4) subject to Subsection (f), the city manager of 11 12 Sweetwater or another person appointed by the Sweetwater City Commission; 13 14 [(5) subject to Subsection (q), the superintendent of 15 the Sweetwater Independent School District or another person appointed by the board of trustees of the Sweetwater Independent 16 17 School District; 18 [(6) one person appointed by the Mitchell County Commissioners Court; 19 20 [(7) one person appointed by the Fisher County 21 Commissioners Court; 22 [(8) the county attorney of Fisher, Mitchell, or Nolan County selected by a majority vote of the county judges of those 23 24 counties; and 25 [(9) one person selected by majority vote of the county judges of Fisher, Mitchell, and Nolan counties, subject to 26

confirmation by a vote of the commissioners courts of each of those

1 counties].

- 2 (b) The juvenile board shall elect one of the members as
 3 chairman [of the board is the county judge appointed under
 4 Subsection (a)(1). The chairman presides at meetings scheduled by
 5 the board].
- 6 (c) The commissioners courts of the counties shall pay the
 7 members of the juvenile board annual supplemental compensation of
 8 \$2,400 from the general fund or any other available fund of the
 9 counties. [The appointed members serve without compensation. Each
 10 member serves a two-year term.]
- The juvenile board shall hold regular meetings on dates 11 12 set by the board and special meetings at the call of the chairman. [The Nolan County Commissioners Court, the Sweetwater City 13 14 Commission, and the board of trustees of the Sweetwater Independent School District may agree to provide the funds for the salaries of 15 the personnel assigned to Nolan County and the other expenses the 16 17 board chairman certifies as necessary to provide adequate juvenile services to Nolan County. The commissioners court, city council, 18 and board of trustees shall each provide one-third of the funds. 19
- 20 (e) The commissioners courts may reimburse a juvenile board
 21 member for the member's reasonable and necessary job-related
 22 expenses. Reimbursable expenses include travel, lodging,
 23 training, and educational activities. [Sections 152.0002,
 24 152.0003, 152.0004, and 152.0005 do not apply to the juvenile board
 25 in Fisher, Mitchell, and Nolan counties.]
- 26 (f) The juvenile board shall pay the salaries of juvenile 27 probation personnel and other expenses the chairman certifies as

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- essential to provide services to children from the juvenile board 1 fund to the extent of the state aid received in the fund. [The board 2 member appointed by the Sweetwater City Commission under Subsection 3 (a) (4) may be appointed only if the City of Sweetwater agrees to 4 provide funds for the salaries of the personnel assigned to Nolan 5 County and other expenses the board chairman certifies as necessary 6 to provide adequate juvenile services to Nolan County as provided 7 8 by Subsection (d).
- 9 The juvenile board shall designate the treasurer or auditor of Fisher County, Mitchell County, or Nolan County to serve 10 as the board's fiscal officer. [The board member appointed by the 11 Sweetwater Independent School District under Subsection (a)(5) may 12 be appointed only if that school district agrees to provide funds 13 14 for the salaries of the personnel assigned to Nolan County and other 15 expenses the board chairman certifies as necessary to provide adequate juvenile services to Nolan County as provided by 16 17 Subsection (d).
- 18 <u>(h) The juvenile board shall appoint an advisory council</u> 19 composed of one person from each county.
- 20 SECTION 4. The following provisions of the Human Resources 21 Code are repealed:
- 22 (1) Sections 152.0821(c), (d), (e), (f), and (g); and
- 23 (2) Sections 152.1741(c), (d), (e), (f), and (g).
- SECTION 5. This Act takes effect October 1, 2017.
