## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The City of Rockwall has long been committed to 2 fostering a dynamic arts scene in its community, and live music has 3 played a vital role in that mission; and

WHEREAS, In 1999, the city government launched the Concert by 4 5 the Lake Series, a four-week program of free concerts on the eastern shore of Lake Ray Hubbard; an instant triumph, the series 6 7 spotlighted regional bands, with each show averaging 175 attendees during the inaugural season; the increasing popularity of the 8 series caused it to be relocated to The Harbor, a retail and 9 entertainment development, in 2007, and two years later, 10 the program was expanded to offer 24 consecutive weeks of live music 11 12 annually; since that time, the concerts have regularly drawn crowds of more than 7,000 people; and 13

14 WHEREAS, The success of the Concert by the Lake Series led to the formation of the city's Live Music Project, which has provided 15 16 invaluable support to area artists and brought a wide variety of 17 musical genres to the community; among the project's many benefits 18 has been the creation of several outdoor venues, including amphitheaters at The Harbor and at Harry Myers Park and two 19 20 permanent stages in the Historic Downtown District; those locations 21 have hosted numerous visiting headliners as well as Rockwall Summer Musicals, the Rockwall Philharmonic Orchestra, and the San Jacinto 22 23 Plaza Music Series, which presents over 50 free concerts each year; 24 and

1 WHEREAS, Since 2004, the annual Rockwall Founders Day 2 Festival has placed special emphasis on live music by featuring 3 regional groups and world-touring acts alike, including such Texas 4 music legends as Robert Earl Keen, Jerry Jeff Walker, and Asleep at 5 the Wheel, as well as the Little River Band, the Marshall Tucker 6 Band, and the Charlie Daniels Band; and

7 WHEREAS, Through the efforts of the City of Rockwall, local 8 residents are now able to enjoy nearly 130 free live music 9 performances each year, and the town's growing reputation as an 10 important music hub has made it a popular destination for travelers 11 from across Texas and beyond; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the 85th Legislature of the State of Texas hereby designate the city of Rockwall as the official Free Live Music Capital of North Texas and urge that free live music continue to be readily available to the residents and visitors of the Lone Star State; and, be it further

17 RESOLVED, That, in accordance with the provisions of Section 18 391.003(e), Government Code, this designation remain in effect 19 until the 10th anniversary of its designation.
