CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Train safety is a vital issue that affects all

Texans, and promoting awareness of correct safety procedures around

3 railroads can potentially save many lives; and

4 WHEREAS, The Texas Department of Insurance reports that a

5 train hits someone in the United States every 115 minutes, often

6 with fatal results, and the nonprofit Operation Lifesaver

7 calculates that an average of nearly 2,000 Americans are killed or

8 injured each year on highway-rail grade crossings; according to the

9 Federal Railroad Administration, in 2015, Texas led the nation in

10 highway-rail grade collisions with 224 such incidents and suffered

11 some 69 pedestrian rail trespass casualties, the second most of any

12 state; and

WHEREAS, A locomotive can take up to one mile to halt after

first applying its brakes, and because the average weight ratio of a

15 train to a car is 4,000 to 1, collisions between the two usually

16 result in tragedy for motor vehicle drivers; it is important to

17 always use caution near railroad crossings, including slowing down,

18 looking both ways, yielding to flashing lights and other signals,

19 and keeping a safe distance from the railroad when stopped; train

20 safety is equally important for pedestrians, and the only safe and

21 legal place to cross railroad tracks is at a designated pedestrian

22 or roadway crossing; and

23 WHEREAS, It is imperative that motorists and pedestrians

24 throughout the Lone Star State better understand the dangers that

- 1 exist around railroads and the necessity of following proper train
- 2 safety practices; now, therefore, be it
- 3 RESOLVED, That the 85th Legislature of the State of Texas
- 4 hereby designate July as Train Safety Awareness Month; and, be it
- 5 further
- 6 RESOLVED, That in accordance with the provisions of Section
- 7 391.004(d), Government Code, this designation remain in effect
- 8 until the 10th anniversary of the date this resolution is finally
- 9 passed by the legislature.
