1 WHEREAS, The Texas Hill Country is home to more than 45

wineries and vineyards, and Fredericksburg is the epicenter of this

WHEREAS, Early in the history of Fredericksburg, settlers

5 used the native mustang grape to make wine; subsequent generations

6 refined the cultivation of grapes and production of wine, and in

7 recent years, several wines produced by Fredericksburg-area

8 vineyards and wineries have won state and national awards,

9 attesting to the high quality of local viticulture; and

10 WHEREAS, More than 600 acres of grapes sprawl north and west

of Fredericksburg, and the concentration of vineyards and wineries

12 along U.S. Highway 290 draws a host of tourists; visitors enjoy

13 patronizing tasting rooms, wine cellars, festivals, and a variety

14 of other events, and several guided tours have been established for

15 the convenience of customers; and

16 WHEREAS, Fredericksburg has been designated as an American

17 Viticultural Area by the Alcohol and Tobacco Tax and Trade Bureau;

18 this appellation officially recognizes a "delimited grape growing

19 region distinguishable by geographical features, the boundaries of

20 which have been recognized and defined"; and

21 WHEREAS, Hill Country wineries and vineyards contribute

22 significantly to the prosperity of Fredericksburg, and they have

23 brought the city international recognition that is a source of

24 pride to area citizens; now, therefore, be it
