RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Serena K. Formby-Condon has demonstrated grace and
 resilience during her nearly decade-long recovery from a traumatic
 brain injury; and

WHEREAS, A former employee of the Texas Legislative Council, Ms. Formby-Condon worked as a computer consultant from 1995 to 2009; she provided computer support to members of the Texas Legislature through several legislative sessions, in addition to contributing her skills as a graphic designer at various times and serving as web administrator for the council's Computer Support Center; and

11 WHEREAS, Ms. Formby-Condon had been dealing with recurring 12 headaches when, on a holiday vacation in Grand Cayman on December 23, 2007, she suddenly collapsed in the home of her friend, Sonja 13 14 Guenter; she was rushed to a hospital, where she was found to be suffering from a severe brain hemorrhage, and arrangements were 15 made to fly her by air ambulance to Miami Regional Hospital in 16 Florida; there, she was kept in a medically induced coma for two 17 weeks as doctors battled to save her life; and 18

WHEREAS, After awakening from her coma, Ms. Formby-Condon learned that she had experienced a basal ganglia hemorrhage, a form of stroke that is fatal in 97 percent of reported cases; her survival was hailed as a miracle by the intensive care nurses who treated her, and she went on to undergo several months of physical therapy at St. David's Rehabilitation Hospital in Austin; while

1 there, she received the support and guidance of a team of therapists
2 that included John Cooper, Beth Bostick, Trish Ann Montoya,
3 Stephanie Coker, Bob Whitford, and Michael Burrows, and thanks in
4 large part to their efforts, she continues to take hopeful steps
5 toward regaining her balance and short-term memory; and

6 WHEREAS, Today, Ms. Formby-Condon serves as a board member of 7 the Texas Brain Injury Alliance and as a member of the Strategic 8 Planning Committee for the Brain Injury Association of America, and she communicates daily with survivors, family members, 9 and caregivers from all over the world as the administrator of an online 10 traumatic brain injury support group; comforted and sustained by 11 her faith, she is also blessed in all her endeavors with the love 12 and partnership of her husband, Mark Condon; and 13

WHEREAS, Having overcome tremendous odds, Serena Formby-Condon continues to inspire all who know her with her commitment to promoting awareness and support for victims of life-threatening brain injuries, and she is indeed deserving of our heartfelt commendation; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 85th Texas 19 Legislature hereby honor Serena K. Formby-Condon on the occasion of 20 National Brain Injury Awareness Month in March 2017, recognize 21 22 18 Brain Injury Awareness March as Day, and extend to 23 Ms. Formby-Condon sincere best wishes for her ongoing recovery; 24 and, be it further
