

R E S O L U T I O N

1           WHEREAS, April 9, 2017, will mark the 11th anniversary of the  
2 Dallas Mega March for American Values and Justice; and

3           WHEREAS, The largest public protest in the city's history,  
4 the Mega March drew between 350,000 and 500,000 participants who  
5 joined together in support of immigration reform; and

6           WHEREAS, This powerful but peaceful gathering was sponsored  
7 by LULAC and a coalition of Dallas-area groups, and it was attended  
8 by throngs of people who trod the mile-long parade route in the  
9 city's downtown; wearing white and carrying signs and American  
10 flags, marchers highlighted the positive economic impact that  
11 immigrants have on the U.S. economy and promoted changes that would  
12 allow foreign workers an easier means of gaining legal status and  
13 citizenship; the Dallas event was part of a series of rallies that  
14 occurred across the country as federal lawmakers considered  
15 immigration reform; and

16           WHEREAS, The Mega March offered further proof that concerned  
17 Texans, Hispanic and non-Hispanic alike, were committed to voicing  
18 their opinions in the immigration debate; that spirit of civic  
19 involvement remains strong, and it continues to both animate public  
20 discussion and drive political activism focused on a range of  
21 critical issues in the Lone Star State; now, therefore, be it

22           RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 85th Texas  
23 Legislature hereby commemorate the 11th anniversary of the Dallas  
24 Mega March for American Values and Justice on April 9, 2017, and pay
