2 University of Texas of the Permian Basin in August 2017, drawing to

3 a close more than 16 years of exemplary service to the university;

5 WHEREAS, A native Texan, David Watts received his bachelor's

6 degree in sociology and English from The University of Texas at

7 Austin and his master's and doctoral degrees in sociology from the

8 State University of New York at Buffalo; early in his academic

9 career, he taught in the sociology and anthropology department of

10 Ohio University and at Southwest Texas State University, where he

11 also served as department chair; he went on to assume the post of

12 dean of the College of Arts and Sciences at Southeastern Louisiana

13 University and subsequently served as vice president for academic

14 and student affairs at Jacksonville State University in Alabama;

16 WHEREAS, Dr. Watts became the fifth president of The

17 University of Texas of the Permian Basin in February 2001, and over

18 the course of his exemplary 15-year tenure, UTPB has grown from

19 2,200 students to more than 6,100, while the enrollment in

20 engineering classes has nearly quintupled, from 111 students in

21 2009 to 541 in 2014; under his stewardship, the university has

22 earned professional accreditation for its programs in business,

23 engineering, nursing, education, music, athletic training, and

 Dr. Watts has overseen the creation of the Wagner Noel Performing
 Arts Center as well as the planning for a new 80,000-square-foot

 that serves nine school districts in Texas, and it has also become
 the first university in Texas to offer a \$10,000 bachelor's degree
