RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Texas Juvenile Justice Professional Day is taking 2 place on January 24, 2017, and this occasion offers an ideal 3 opportunity to recognize the outstanding contributions of the 4 dedicated individuals working in this field; and

5 WHEREAS, The Texas juvenile justice system is regarded as one 6 of the most innovative in the country and is composed of 166 7 community-based probation departments that serve the state's 254 8 counties in partnership with the Texas Juvenile Justice Department; 9 and

WHEREAS, More than 8,200 certified juvenile probation and supervision officers work tirelessly and courageously to help rehabilitate young people, handling 100 percent of the referrals received by the juvenile justice system each year and providing ongoing services at the local level to 95 percent of those referrals; and

WHEREAS, When dealing with young offenders, the Texas legal 16 system depends on the efforts of juvenile court judges, juvenile 17 prosecutors, juvenile defense attorneys and advocates, and law 18 enforcement officers and their staff to break the cycle of youth 19 20 crime and violence and protect the public from delinquent conduct; to ensure the consistency and quality of such services throughout 21 the state, Texas Juvenile Justice Department staff members also 22 23 offer assistance and training to all juvenile justice personnel, in addition to providing rehabilitation services directly to young 24

1 offenders committed to the department's facilities; and

2 WHEREAS, Through their hard work and expertise, juvenile 3 justice professionals make a positive difference in the lives of 4 at-risk youth and help maintain the security of the citizens of 5 Texas, and their contributions are indeed deserving of recognition; 6 now, therefore, be it

7 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 85th Texas 8 Legislature hereby recognize January 24, 2017, as Texas Juvenile 9 Justice Professional Day and commend youth probation personnel, 10 members of the Texas Juvenile Justice Department, and all those 11 involved in the juvenile justice field for the essential services 12 they provide.
