RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, The Lone Star State lost an esteemed citizen with 2 the passing of Nelda McQuien Laney of Hale Center on August 24, 3 2016, at the age of 73; and

WHEREAS, The daughter of Helen and John McQuien, the former 4 5 Nelda McQuien was born in Garza County on June 7, 1943; she graduated from Plainview High School and went on to complete her 6 bachelor's degree in education with honors at Texas Tech 7 University, where she met her future husband, James E. "Pete" 8 9 Laney; the couple became the parents of four children, James, KaLyn, Jamey, and J. Pete, and later welcomed into their family six 10 grandchildren, Austin, Grant, Gavin, and Holden Phillips and 11 12 Clayton and Kendall Laney; and

13 WHEREAS, Mrs. Laney taught in Hale Center schools, and as her 14 husband pursued a career in public life, she became a splendid campaigner; during his long tenure in the Texas House of 15 Representatives, including five terms as speaker, Mrs. Laney 16 provided invaluable assistance, and she led the effort to restore 17 the State Capitol and served as vice chair of the Texas Capitol 18 Restoration Celebration and as co-chair of the Capitol Fund Drive, 19 20 which raised private money for furnishings; in order to sustain 21 continuing preservation efforts and related educational programs, she created a series of collectible Texas Capitol holiday 22 23 ornaments, which became enormously successful, generating more than \$8 million to date; and 24

1 WHEREAS, In 2004, Mrs. Laney implemented a commemorative ornament series for Keep Texas Beautiful, and for a dozen years, she 2 3 handled everything from the selection of themes to marketing and public relations; she was the most successful salesperson for the 4 program and attended the organization's annual conferences each 5 summer in order to promote the project; along the way, she designed 6 ornaments for more than a dozen other entities across the state, 7 8 among them Texas Tech; and

9 WHEREAS, Mrs. Laney worked tirelessly in behalf of her alma 10 mater, serving as national president of the Texas Tech Alumni Association and chairing the fund-raising committee for the \$4.5 11 12 million McKenzie-Merket Alumni Center expansion; in addition, she served on the boards of the Texas Book Festival, the Friends of 13 14 Libraries and Archives of Texas, the National Center for Missing 15 and Exploited Children, and Greater Texas Community Partners, and she was a member of Kappa Alpha Theta, the Omega Delphi Study Club, 16 17 the Caprock District Women's Club, and a host of other organizations; and 18

19 WHEREAS, Widely admired for her vision and leadership, Mrs. Laney won the affectionate nickname "the First Lady of West 20 Texas"; her work on the Capitol restoration earned a Star of Texas 21 Preservation Award and special recognition from the Texas Women's 22 23 Alliance; moreover, she was the recipient of the inaugural Woman of 24 Achievement Award from the Texas Federation of Women's Clubs, and she was selected as Woman of the Year in both Plainview and Hale 25 26 Center; in 2007, she and her husband received the Texas Tech Alumni Association's Lauro F. Cavazos Award, and two years later, she was 27

named a Distinguished Alumna of the Texas Tech College of
Education; she was also inducted into the Future Homemakers of
America Texas Hall of Fame and was named a Lifetime Member of the
Girl Scouts; and

5 WHEREAS, While pursuing her many civic endeavors, Mrs. Laney 6 made time for her cherished family and many friends, and she was a 7 surrogate mother and grandmother to countless people; her warmth, 8 kindness, grace, and good humor brightened the days of everyone 9 around her; and

10 WHEREAS, Nelda Laney demonstrated her great love for Texas 11 and its people in myriad ways, and although she is deeply missed by 12 all who were privileged to share in her love and friendship, her 13 enormous contributions will continue to resonate for years to come; 14 now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 85th Texas Legislature hereby pay special tribute to the life of Nelda McQuien Laney and extend profound condolences to her loved ones; and, be it further

19 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be 20 prepared for her family and that when the Texas House of 21 Representatives adjourns this day, it do so in memory of Nelda 22 Laney.
