9 WHEREAS, Early in his academic career, Dr. Auerbach worked

for several colleges and universities in Illinois, Kansas, and

11 Virginia before joining the faculty of American University, where

12 he rose to full professor; while living in Washington, D.C., he also

13 served as an economist for the Federal Reserve System, the House of

14 Representatives Committee on Banking, Finance, and Urban Affairs,

15 and the Department of the Treasury; and

16 WHEREAS, Professor Auerbach taught at the University of

17 California-Riverside from 1983 until 1993, when he returned to

18 Washington to serve for six years as an economist for the House

19 Committee on Banking and Financial Services; he was the author of

20 four well-regarded books and dozens of scholarly articles, and for

21 the final 18 years of his career, he served as a professor of public

22 affairs at the Lyndon B. Johnson School of Public Affairs at The

23 University of Texas at Austin, where he earned the deep respect and

24 lasting affection of his colleagues and his students; he retired
