RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Since its ratification in 1994, the North American 2 Free Trade Agreement has produced great opportunities for economic 3 growth and development in the United States and our bordering 4 countries; and

5 WHEREAS, According to the U.S. Census Bureau, American trade 6 with Canada and Mexico has tripled under NAFTA, reaching an annual 7 total of \$1 trillion in 2015; Mexico is America's third-largest 8 export market for agricultural products, including corn, soybeans, 9 dairy, pork, and beef, and each year Texas sends about 36 percent of 10 the state's total exports to Mexico; and

11 WHEREAS, NAFTA has significantly benefited American workers 12 by creating myriad new avenues for employment; a 2014 study 13 conducted by the U.S. Chamber of Commerce showed that nearly five 14 million U.S. jobs, including some 350,000 in Texas, are supported 15 by increased trade from NAFTA; in addition, 90 percent of Fortune 16 500 companies have investments in Mexico; and

WHEREAS, Any increase in tariffs on Mexican imports would also raise U.S. prices for American-made goods, because the cost of parts produced in Mexico and shipped to manufacturing facilities in the United States would rise steeply; this fallout from a change in our trade policy would have an especially great impact on consumers of automobiles and electronics; and

23 WHEREAS, Through NAFTA, Canada and Mexico have become 24 America's largest and third-largest trading partners,

1 respectively, and a major change to this historic agreement would 2 place the continued growth of our economy at risk; now, therefore, 3 be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 85th Texas
Legislature hereby respectfully urge Congress to preserve the North
American Free Trade Agreement and work toward expanding economic
opportunity through international commerce for the betterment of
our country; and, be it further

9 RESOLVED, That the chief clerk of the house forward official 10 copies of this resolution to the president of the United States, to 11 the president of the Senate and the speaker of the House of 12 Representatives of the United States Congress, and to all the 13 members of the Texas delegation to Congress with the request that 14 this resolution be entered in the Congressional Record as a 15 memorial to the Congress of the United States of America.
