- 3 February 4, 2017, at the age of 87; and
- WHEREAS, "Memo" Avila was born in El Paso on November 6, 1929,
- 5 to Evaristo and Carmen Avila; he began working at the age of 12, as a
- 6 delivery boy and butcher in his father's grocery store; after
- 7 graduating as valedictorian from El Paso Technical High School, he
- 8 attended the Texas College of Mines; from 1948 to 1956, he served
- 9 his nation as a member of the National Guard; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Mr. Avila was joined in matrimony to Isabel
- 11 Lightbourn in 1953, and they shared their lives for more than 63
- 12 years; he was the proud father of four children, Bill, Andy,
- 13 Annette, and Amanda, and later in life, he was blessed with six
- 14 grandchildren, James, Thomas, Kristina, Roldan, Anthony, and
- 15 Lucas; and
- WHEREAS, In 1952, Mr. Avila bought one of the popular Leo's
- 17 Mexican Restaurant locations from his uncles, Leo Collins and
- 18 Willie Terrazas, and he taught himself to cook while his father ran
- 19 the dining room; they moved the restaurant to the Coronado Shopping
- 20 Center in 1962, and a decade later, Mr. Avila built his own
- 21 restaurant on North Mesa Street, changing the name from Leo's to
- 22 Avila's in 1988 and opening another location on the east side of El
- 23 Paso; the Mesa Street location is still thriving under the
- 24 direction of his children Andy and Annette; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Mr. Avila also owned a self-storage business, an
- 2 apartment building, a trailer park, a chili-processing business,
- 3 and other enterprises; he served as president of the El Paso
- 4 Restaurant Association and as a board member of Pan American
- 5 Savings and Loan, the American Heart Association, the Greater El
- 6 Paso Chamber of Commerce, and the El Paso Community Foundation,
- 7 among others; he was inducted into the Texas Restaurant
- 8 Association's Hall of Honor and named Outstanding Restaurateur of
- 9 the Year in 1980; and
- 10 WHEREAS, A founding member of the Santa Teresa Country Club,
- 11 Mr. Avila was an avid golfer for nearly four decades, playing until
- 12 he was 80 years old; he expressed his strong religious faith by
- 13 regularly attending St. Matthew Catholic Church; and
- WHEREAS, A loving husband, a doting father and grandfather,
- 15 and a hardworking entrepreneur, Memo Avila lived a full and
- 16 generous life, and he will forever be a source of inspiration to all
