- 16 6,000 employees of municipal courts work diligently to ensure the
- 17 fair administration of justice while upholding the rigorous

- 20 prosecutors, juvenile case managers, bailiffs, and warrant
- 21 officers continually strive to improve the administration of
- 22 justice through participation in judicial education programs,
- 23 seminars, workshops, and the annual meetings of their state and
