WHEREAS, March 22, 2017, is the first Texas Energy Day at the
State Capitol; and

3 WHEREAS, Texas leads the United States in oil and natural gas 4 production, refining capacity, and pipeline miles, all of which 5 contribute to an unprecedented level of American energy security; 6 in 2016, the country's net imports of crude oil hit a 20-year low, 7 and in fiscal year 2016, the industry generated \$9.4 billion in 8 taxes and royalties that directly fund our schools, roads, and 9 emergency services; and

10 WHEREAS, Many Texas oil and natural gas companies are leading 11 the way in developing new technologies designed to reduce water 12 use, expand water reuse, and increase the use of naturally 13 occurring salt water in their operations; and

WHEREAS, Thanks to additional innovation and advances in technology, carbon dioxide emissions associated with energy production dropped 12 percent between 2005 and 2015, and today, natural gas production has one of the smallest carbon footprints of traditional fuel sources; moreover, although oil and natural gas production have increased, methane levels have remained flat as companies continuously work to reduce emissions; and
