1           WHEREAS, Terry Mills of Corpus Christi is being recognized by  
2 the Federal Bureau of Investigation with a 2016 Director's  
3 Community Leadership Award at a ceremony in Washington, D.C., on  
4 April 28, 2017; and

5           WHEREAS, Created in 1990, this honor is annually presented to  
6 individuals and organizations that have contributed to their  
7 communities through their work in combating crime, terrorism,  
8 drugs, and violence; and

9           WHEREAS, Mr. Mills has served as president of the Corpus  
10 Christi chapter of the NAACP since 2009, and he is also the  
11 organization's area coordinator for the Rio Grande Valley and  
12 Nueces County; throughout his tenure, he has tirelessly advocated  
13 for civil rights and supported education and youth outreach  
14 initiatives in the region; in 2016, he brought together law  
15 enforcement agencies, including the FBI, with local organizations,  
16 businesses, and schools for a youth summit, which was attended by  
17 more than 4,000 area high school students; participating agencies  
18 discussed a range of topics, including domestic violence, hate  
19 crimes, and religious and cultural differences; and

21 positive change to the region, and his efforts have produced  
22 results of lasting benefit to countless Texans; now, therefore, be
