1 WHEREAS, A life of professional achievement and dedicated 2 public service drew to a close with the passing of former state 3 representative Jack Harvey Harris on March 13, 2017, at the age of 4 85; and

5 WHEREAS, The son of Frank and Marguerite Curry Harris, Jack Harris was born in Houston on December 12, 1931; he enlisted in the 6 7 United States Air Force in 1953 and proudly served his country for eight years, rising to the rank of captain; during and after his 8 career in the military, he attended a number of different colleges, 9 including Texas A&M University, and he went on to complete 10 11 bachelor's and master's degrees and a doctoral degree in dental 12 surgery; and

13 WHEREAS, Dr. Harris built a successful private practice of 14 dentistry and periodontics, which he operated from 1961 to 1991; he also shared his expertise as an assistant and associate professor 15 16 of periodontics at The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston and as a member of the advisory board of the Health Law & 17 Policy Institute at the University of Houston Law Center; a leader 18 in his profession, he served as president of both the Texas and 19 American Dental Associations, and he held membership in the Houston 20 21 District Dental Society and other groups; recognized with myriad honors throughout his career, he published widely in local, state, 22 23 and national dental journals and delivered presentations at 24 conferences and universities around the world; and
