R E S O L U T I O N

3 passed away on January 17, 2017, at the age of 36; and

5 on May 2, 1980, and grew up in Fort Worth; after graduating from  
6 Arlington Heights High School in 1998, he attended Texas Christian  
7 University on a football scholarship, playing offensive guard for

11 Mr. Harbuck enjoyed working with doctors, nurses, and other medical  
12 personnel; he also found time to volunteer, serving on the board of  
13 directors for the Fort Worth Stock Show and Rodeo and on the  
14 committee for the event's popular Calf Scramble; in addition, he  
15 was a passionate supporter of Black Dog Charity, a nonprofit  
16 devoted to providing assistance to those affected by leukemia and  
17 lymphoma, and a faithful congregant of Trinity Bible Church in  
18 Willow Park; and

19 WHEREAS, Mr. Harbuck married the love of his life, the former  
20 Emery Holloway, on October 29, 2005, and the couple were blessed  
21 with two treasured children, Hudson and Harper; and
