2 Department is serving as an inspiring role model for many young men
3 in his community through his work with the Boys of Valor Club at
4 Manuel Jara Elementary School; and

5 WHEREAS, Boys of Valor stands for "Boys Who Value Academics,
6 Leadership, Obedience, and Respect"; the club was founded by the
7 school principal, Marta Plata, as a program for boys in the fifth
8 grade with the goal of encouraging positive behaviors and reducing
9 bullying, gang recruitment, and disrespect for teachers; and

10 WHEREAS, In support of this worthwhile effort, Officer
11 Aguilar and two of his fellow FWPD officers visit the school weekly
12 to speak to the club's members about leadership and to engage
13 participants in a game of football or basketball; the officers
14 occasionally have lunch with the students as well, and they have
15 also helped to deliver Christmas trees during the holiday season
16 and participated in bicycle raffles; and

17 WHEREAS, A resident of the same North Division that he
18 serves, Officer Aguilar joined the FWPD in 2002 after fulfilling
19 his lifelong dream of becoming a United States citizen; in his work
20 as a neighborhood police officer, he enjoys acting as a liaison to
21 the Spanish-speaking community, and he often takes part in local
22 events, where he can assist in building the public's confidence in
23 his department; and

24 WHEREAS, By generously devoting his time and energy to this

1 worthwhile effort, Officer Juan Aguilar is helping set club members
2 on the path to becoming responsible and productive citizens and
3 fostering a stronger relationship between the police and young men
4 in the community; now, therefore, be it
