RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, Lyme disease and other tick-borne diseases are most
- 2 frequently diagnosed in the spring and summer months, and Texans
- 3 need to be aware of the dangers related to these debilitating and
- 4 potentially fatal illnesses; and
- 5 WHEREAS, In addition to Lyme disease, which is the most
- 6 prevalent, tick-transmitted illnesses include Rocky Mountain
- 7 spotted fever, ehrlichiosis, bartonellosis, babesiosis, and
- 8 tick-borne relapsing fever; in the State of Texas, the black-legged
- 9 deer tick, the Lone Star tick, and the brown dog tick are all known
- 10 carriers of these types of diseases; and
- 11 WHEREAS, If not properly diagnosed and treated soon after
- 12 infection occurs, any of these illnesses can become substantially
- 13 more difficult to treat and can lead to life-threatening
- 14 complications; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Lyme disease is the fastest-growing infectious
- 16 disease and the most common vector-borne illness in Texas, with
- 17 cases having been reported in every public health region in the
- 18 state; according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention,
- 19 there are more than 300,000 cases of Lyme disease reported annually
- 20 in the United States; such figures may not give the full picture,
- 21 however, because Lyme disease and other tick-borne illnesses are
- 22 thought to be underreported due to a limited awareness among the
- 23 public and within medical circles of the serious nature of these
- 24 easily contracted diseases; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Greater public understanding is key to lessening the
- 2 threat of these diseases in our state, and the observance of Lyme
- 3 Disease Awareness Month in May will assist in promoting much-needed
- 4 education on this important health issue; now, therefore, be it
- 5 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 85th Texas
- 6 Legislature hereby recognize May 2017 as Lyme Disease Awareness
- 7 Month in the State of Texas and encourage residents to learn more
- 8 about Lyme disease and other tick-borne illnesses.
