WHEREAS, Born on March 6, 1962, to Joe and Ruthy Wittenburg, 4 5 David Wittenburg grew up with a brother, Alex, and three sisters, Leslie, Donna, and Michelle; he attended public schools in Lometa, 6 where he excelled in track and field and other sports, and his 7 interest in athletics led him to obtain a bachelor's degree in 8 9 physical education from Angelo State University; following his 10 graduation, he began his career as a physical education teacher and 11 coach in the Northside Independent School District in San Antonio; 12 and

13 WHEREAS, During his time as a schoolteacher, Dr. Wittenburg 14 developed an interest in studying the cardiovascular health of children; he returned to college, earning a master's degree in 15 16 physical education from Texas State University and a Ph.D. in kinesiology from Texas A&M University; he went on to hold faculty 17 appointments at New Mexico State University, the University of New 18 Mexico, and The University of Texas at Brownsville before being 19 20 hired to chair the Department of Kinesiology at The University of 21 Texas at El Paso; over the course of his career, his work was presented at conferences hosted by the American College of Sports 22 23 Medicine and Frontiers of Cardiology, as well as at the International Obesity Conference, and he was a member of the ACSM 24

10 WHEREAS, Dr. David Wittenburg enjoyed a life that was rich in 11 personal and professional achievements, and he will long be 12 remembered with admiration and affection by those he leaves behind; 13 now, therefore, be it
