R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, During the month of March 2017, the Texas Panhandle
2 suffered multiple, massive wildfires, and Josh Archer of the
3 Allison Volunteer Fire Department was part of a coalition of first
4 responders who fought heroically and tenaciously to save the lives
5 and property of Texans in the region; and

6 WHEREAS, Fueled by dry vegetation, high winds, and
7 unseasonably hot weather, the fast-moving wildfires broke out on
8 March 6 and raged for days, destroying around 500,000 acres of Texas
9 prairie land and resulting in the death of four people; the fires
10 were some of the largest in state history and led to Governor Greg
11 Abbott's declaring a state of emergency in six counties; and

12 WHEREAS, The combined efforts of fire personnel from around
13 and beyond the region, including members of local volunteer fire
14 departments, were needed to contain the blazes; working exhausting
15 hours in perilous conditions, these dedicated individuals risked
16 their lives to halt the fires' rampage and rescue residents, and
17 their contributions were vital to averting further tragedy and
18 destruction; and

19 WHEREAS, In answering the call of duty during this
20 catastrophic crisis, Josh Archer demonstrated an extraordinary
21 commitment to protecting the safety of his fellow citizens, and he
22 has earned the enduring gratitude and admiration of Texans across
23 the state; now, therefore, be it
