WHEREAS, Central High School in Galveston is commemorating
the 132nd anniversary of its founding with a three-day celebration
on June 18-20, 2017; and

WHEREAS, The first African American high school in Texas, 4 5 Central High School was organized in 1885 and operated in its earliest years first in rented quarters on 16th Street and then at a 6 location on 15th Street; in 1893, a dedicated six-classroom 7 facility designed by famed architect Nicholas Clayton was 8 9 constructed on Avenue M, and a new wing was later added to accommodate the growing student population; this space housed the 10 11 school until it transitioned in 1954 to its final location between 12 31st and 33rd Streets; and

WHEREAS, Following the integration of Galveston public schools, Central High was closed in 1968; the Old Central Cultural Center was established in 1974 in the former school building on Avenue M, and it continues to serve as a landmark to preserve the legacy of this historic institution, which provided vital educational opportunities to more than 40,000 young men and women during its 83 years of operation; and

20 WHEREAS, Central High School remains an important part of the 21 rich heritage of the city of Galveston, and the anniversary of its 22 establishment offers a welcome occasion to recognize its many 23 significant contributions to the Lone Star State; now, therefore, 24 be it
