R E S O L U T I O N

1 WHEREAS, Weldon Burgoon shuttered Weldon's Saddle Shop and
2 Western Wear in Denton in January 2017, drawing to a close a
3 remarkable career as a master craftsman that spanned six decades;
4 and

5 WHEREAS, After graduating from high school in 1947,
6 Mr. Burgoon went to work in his father's plumbing business; as a
7 sideline, his mother sewed Western-style shirts and sold them in
8 the family's shop, and in the evenings, Mr. Burgoon began to work
9 with leather and make belts; and

10 WHEREAS, In 1957, Mr. Burgoon bought a sewing machine and
11 opened Weldon's Saddle Shop and Western Wear in downtown Denton;
12 there, he created custom leather goods, including more than 150
13 saddles, while also selling a wide variety of Western wear and
14 accessories, such as boots, hats, jeans, belts and buckles, Western
15 books and gift items, Breyer model horses, and rodeo equipment; and

16 WHEREAS, Mr. Burgoon was inducted into the Texas Rodeo Cowboy
17 Hall of Fame in 2010, and his shop won designation as a Denton
18 County Heritage Business in 2016 from the Denton County Office of
19 History and Culture; his grandson, Clint Wilkinson, who got his
20 start in the shop, has since opened his own luxury leather store
21 next door, carrying on the family trade; and

22 WHEREAS, Texas has a strong tradition of innovation and
23 entrepreneurship, and over the course of 60 years, Weldon Burgoon's
24 dedication, artistry, and craftsmanship earned Weldon's Saddle

1 Shop and Western Wear the status of a treasured community
2 institution; now, therefore, be it

3 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the 85th Texas
4 Legislature hereby congratulate Weldon Burgoon on his retirement
5 and extend to him sincere best wishes for the future; and, be it
6 further

7 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be
8 prepared for Mr. Burgoon as an expression of high regard by the
9 Texas House of Representatives.
