## RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Albert Duran, a senior at Earl Warren High School in 2 San Antonio, has enlisted in the United States Navy, and his 3 experiences during the enlistment process have helped inspire the 4 filing of Senate Bill 1152 during the 85th Texas Legislature; and

5 WHEREAS, Determined to serve his nation after he graduates, 6 Mr. Duran took time off from school to take the oath of enlistment 7 and to complete other requirements; these absences were counted 8 against his attendance record, as Texas law does not permit missing 9 school for such a purpose, even though high school students are 10 allowed up to two days of absences to visit college campuses; and

11 WHEREAS, Mr. Duran's story gained the attention of Texas 12 State Senator José Menéndez, who subsequently introduced S.B. 1152 to address the issue; the legislation would allow students 17 years 13 14 of age or older to miss up to four days of school for the purpose of pursuing enlistment in a branch of the U.S. armed services or the 15 Texas National Guard; in support of the bill, Mr. Duran traveled to 16 the State Capitol on March 8, 2017, to testify before the Senate 17 18 Committee on Veteran Affairs and Border Security; and

WHEREAS, Albert Duran is the son of Ernesto and Sabrena Duran; in choosing to join the armed forces, he is following in the footsteps of his father, who has proudly served as a member of the U.S. Army; and

23 WHEREAS, This notable young Texan has demonstrated an 24 exceptional commitment not only to defending his country but also

1 to assisting other students considering military careers, and he is 2 truly deserving of special recognition for his efforts; now, 3 therefore, be it
