1 WHEREAS, Family and friends are mourning the loss of Robert 2 Gaylan Duncan of Victoria, who passed away on November 13, 2016, at 3 the age of 82; and

WHEREAS, Gaylan Duncan was born in Tivoli on January 19, 4 5 1934, the youngest of the eight children of Joseph and Mamie Mae Duncan; following his graduation from Austwell-Tivoli High School, 6 he attended Victoria College and went on to complete courses of 7 study at the Commonwealth College of Mortuary Science and the 8 National Foundation of Funeral Service School of Management; as a 9 young man during the Korean War, he answered his nation's call to 10 11 duty and served in the United States Army; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Duncan enjoyed a fulfilling career in the funeral service industry that spanned five and a half decades; after gaining experience at various funeral homes in Victoria and Houston, he opened Colonial Funeral Home in Victoria in 1969; he later expanded the business to other parts of Texas, eventually operating 29 funeral homes and 3 cemeteries before his retirement at the age of 81; and

WHEREAS, This esteemed Texan was active in a host of professional organizations, and in recognition of his eminent stature in his field, he was selected as the 1984-1985 Outstanding Funeral Director of the Year by the Texas Funeral Directors Association; he also gave generously of his time and talents to a host of civic, faith-based, and fraternal organizations; a life

member of Optimist International and president of three Rotary 1 Clubs, he chaired the Victoria County United Way and the Victoria 2 3 Chamber of Commerce, led the board of the Victoria Senior Citizens Association, and served as a member of the Victoria Planning 4 5 Commission; in 1991, he was honored as the Outstanding Citizen of the Year in Victoria; Mr. Duncan was additionally a longtime 6 parishioner and member of the board of Holy Family Catholic Church, 7 8 and he held a number of offices in the Knights of Columbus; he was appointed to the Order of St. Gregory the Great by Pope John Paul 9 10 II; and

11 WHEREAS, Mr. Duncan was a devoted husband to his wife, the 12 former Ella Wepreck, with whom he shared a rewarding marriage of 13 nearly six decades; today, the couple's treasured family includes 14 daughters and sons-in-law Gail and Russell Janecka and Mary and 15 Scott Joy, as well as grandchildren Robert and his wife Sarah, 16 Julie, Kevin, and Megan, and a great-grandson, Elliott; and

17 WHEREAS, Gaylan Duncan lived a rich and purposeful life 18 centered on his faith, his family, and his community, and he will 19 long be remembered with deep affection by all who knew him; now, 20 therefore, be it
