## RESOLUTION

- 1 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the State of 2 Texas, 85th Legislature, Regular Session, 2017, That House Rule 13, Section 9(a), be suspended in part as provided by House Rule 13, 3 Section 9(f), to enable the conference committee appointed to 4 resolve the differences on Senate Bill 968 (a sexual assault policy at certain public and private institutions of higher education and 6 to requiring those institutions to provide students and employees 7 an option to electronically report certain offenses to the 8 institution) to consider and take action on the following matter: 9 House Rule 13, Section 9(a)(4), is suspended to permit the 10 11 committee to add text on a matter which is not included in either 12 the house or senate version of the bill in SECTION 1 of the bill, in amended Section 51.9363, Education Code, to read as follows: 13
- Sec. 51.9363. [CAMPUS] SEXUAL ASSAULT POLICY. (a) In this section, "postsecondary educational institution" means an ["] institution of higher education or a private or independent institution of higher education, as those terms are defined [" has the meaning assigned] by Section 61.003.
- (b) Each <u>postsecondary educational</u> institution [<del>of higher</del> 20 <del>education</del>] shall adopt a policy on [<del>campus</del>] sexual assault applicable to each student enrolled at and each employee of the institution. The policy must:
- 23 (1) include:
- 24 (A) definitions of prohibited behavior;

- 1 (B) sanctions for violations; and
- 2 (C) the protocol for reporting and responding to
- 3 reports of [campus] sexual assault; and
- 4 (2) be approved by the institution's governing board
- 5 before final adoption by the institution.
- 6 (c) Each <u>postsecondary educational</u> institution [<del>of higher</del>
- 7 education] shall make the institution's [campus] sexual assault
- 8 policy available to students, faculty, and staff members by:
- 9 (1) including the policy in the institution's student
- 10 handbook and personnel handbook; and
- 11 (2) creating and maintaining a web page on the
- 12 institution's Internet website dedicated solely to the policy.
- 13 (d) Each postsecondary educational institution [of higher
- 14 education] shall require each entering freshman or undergraduate
- 15 transfer student to attend an orientation on the institution's
- 16 [campus] sexual assault policy before or during the first semester
- 17 or term in which the student is enrolled at the institution. The
- 18 institution shall establish the format and content of the
- 19 orientation.
- 20 Explanation: This addition is necessary to expand to private
- 21 or independent institutions of higher education the requirements
- 22 regarding a sexual assault policy and to require the policy to
- 23 encompass all incidents of sexual assault, regardless of whether
- 24 those incidents occur on or off campus.
